Davenport School Museum Jim & Maureen Schebler



Jim and Maureen Schebler have a lifelong interest in history, especially local and regional history. Maureen graduated from Marycrest College in Davenport with majors in social studies and secondary education. Jim graduated from St. Ambrose College with majors in political science and secondary education.

In high school and college Maureen was employed in a variety of positions in the Davenport Public Library. After spending time as a stay at home mom in the early years of their marriage, Maureen was employed by the Davenport Public School as a para-educator in media.

Jim was employed by the Rock Island Public Schools for 39 years as a teacher of social studies. After his retirement he was employed as a part time instructor in the Education Department at Augustana College in Rock Island for 10 years. He taught the secondary social studies methods course and also worked with the supervision of student teachers. Several articles that he has co-authored have been published in Illinois History Teacher magazine.

Today Jim and Maureen are volunteers at the Davenport School Museum and have been working on digitalizing items in the collection of the museum and preparing presentations based on these collections.

The Davenport School Museum is a tremendous community resource with exhibits, documents, and artifacts that tell the story of the growth and progress of Davenport Schools for more than 150 years. It is staffed completely by volunteers who cover the limited schedule (Monday mornings and Friday afternoons). Tasks include organizing, filing, creating reference materials, creating PowerPoint presentations, and researching archival materials. Western Illinois University

Dr. Joseph Rives from WIU had to send the "B" team to speak at Rotary, as he had another commitment that he had to keep. Gary Rowe, Director of Development (and the B team) and Andy, Director of Academics Support were present to give a very informational program. Gary asked each table to think of an appropriate question for the 2 of them. As each question was asked, valuable information was given to 60 attendee's.

The new campus in Moline is on time and under budget. It is a Gold level LEED project. WQPT is part of the WIU campus and is struggling to retain its membership. The average age of WIU's students is 32, they are married, work & have 2 kids. Fifty students are enrolled in the MBA program. Total enrollment is 1460. Only junior & senior level classes are offered at WIU. They are more than happy to let Scott Community College and Blackhawk take care of the first 2 years of education. Sticker price of one year of tuition is \$8000.

Guests on Friday were Sherri and Amy Briegel and Andrew Burt, guest of Teresa Paper. Eric Langan did an excellent job of selling all the John Deere Classic tickets that we had, due to the Birdies for Charity donation the club made. He was also the sergeant and collected \$13 in fines.

Charlie announced that the Board of Directors had voted to give \$500 to the History Day group, which is taking their project to the Smithsonian Institute in Washington D.C. Two members of the team are Emily Bainter and Taylor Gehrls, granddaughters of Bob Bainter and Ken Tank. Because of that Bob gave an additional \$50 to the Paul Harris Foundation. Steve Suiter gave \$25 to the education fund, for another son's graduation and Chuck gave \$35 in honor of his & Sherri's wedding anniversary.

Dr. Anita will be the chair of the water stop on N. 9th Street in Eldridge, during the Moonlight Chase on July 9. Cody Allen volunteered to have the "after" party at his house. Other volunteers to date are Loren & Jody Rickard. She will need about 6-7 more helpers.
