## SCOTT COMMUNITY COLLEGE TOUR JUNE 25, 2010

Dr. Teresa Paper and several members of the staff at Scott Community College greeted only 38 Rotarians and guests to a fine lunch at the Student Life Center. President of Scott Community College, Dr. Tom Coley gave an official welcome to everyone present. Both Tom and Teresa began at SCC in 2005. Since then, there has been a terrific expansion of the facilities. They expect a 25% increase in students this fall, which is an approximate total of 6000 students. The Kahl center in downtown Davenport will have about 750 students.

Teresa gave information on the average student age and graduation rate. She said that most students go part time and graduate in three years. Students that are 40 years old or older graduate in four years. The placement rate for SCC students is very high. About one half of their graduates go on to a four year university. She also told about some new student housing being built on Devil's Glen Road.

John Pheiffer gave the invocation and John Maxwell introduced two guests. They were Anastasiya Pasheyeva, guest of Serge Pasheev and Joe Steele, guest of Dr. Anita Wubbena. Bill Tubbs was welcomed back from the International Rotary Conference in Montreal, Canada and he gave \$10 in honor of his youngest daughter's wedding on Saturday, June 26.

Other items discussed were: the Installation Dinner for new president, Charlie Jones on July 8, the Moonlight Chase water station being organized by Dr. Anita on July 10 and the opportunity to volunteer to work at the Mississippi Valley Fair, August 3-8 for Per Mar Security. Following lunch, Teresa and her many helpers from the SCC facility, gave guided tours of various areas of study on the Bettendorf campus. Thank you Teresa for the wonderful opportunity!! (and the good food!)
