Emotional Hope and Healing through the hearts of rescued horses With Michele Allison

We assist children in the Quad Cities that are currently in counseling from either physical, sexual, or emotional abuse, or any other form of emotional trauma. We structure our sessions with the children free of charge and operation using the techniques taught through an organization called Equine Assisted Growth and earning out of Utah. So far we have seen amazing results with children who have not been able to progress in the standard counseling that they have received and this alternative outlet has been a great help to the counselors. They expand on the information we gather in our sessions in their offices and dramatic improvements have been seen in as little as 3 sessions. The sessions

are not horseback riding, but rather activities on the ground using labels to prompt thoughts and patterns that come up for them in real life and the behavior of the horses give us clues that we use to ask them questions and make self discoveries.
