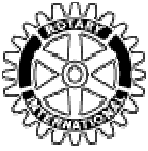
ANNUAL AUCTION – OCTOBER 28

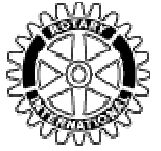

MARIA FLORES: U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission

Maria Flores from the Milwaukee office of the United States EEOC office was the speaker at the last meeting. She helps people who feel they have been discriminated against in any way, especially employment discrimination. She has held this position for nineteen years and helps people file charges against their employer, gives free educational presentations and technical assistance. Maria says that 15% of all workers feel discriminated against. Claims against employers were very high in 2008 and 2009.

Maria became the first bilingual/Spanish speaking investigator for the Milwaukee office. She is responsible for five Midwest states which comprise the Chicago District. She sets up and teaches the EEO training, educational outreach and provides technical assistance.

Maria is a member of Rotary Amigos de Milwaukee, which is a new club, about one year old. Maria was in the Quad City area on other speaking engagements, so the North Scott Rotary meeting fit into her schedule. She was impressed with the membership numbers and our weekly newsletter.

Numerous Rotary functions are coming up in the next few weeks. Leroy is looking for helpers for the home Iowa Hawkeye games and Jeff Helms and his committee is busy making final preparations for the golf outing. Kara Maxwell introduced her Rotary reads program at Ed White Elementary
