MAYOR OF DAVENPORT – BILL GLUBA
September 17, 2010

Mayor Gluba says that Davenport is in the top 100 cities in the United States to do business in. Quad Cities First (formerly Davenport One) encourages business to locate in the Quad Cities. They also apply for federal money to aid the schools.

The City of Davenport has 857 employees, of which 171 are police officers and 144 are fire fighters. Crime is down in Davenport and there have been no layoffs. Davenport has 706 miles of streets that are swept six times each year. The Medic ambulance service gives the city excellent service and responds within five minutes to any emergency call.

Mr. Gluba was glad to announce that 1000 new people live in downtown Davenport in all the new loft apartments that have been created. The Hotel Blackhawk has a \$40 million renovation project going on and will be reopening in December 2010. The Farmers Market now has 200 vendors and 10,000 shoppers this year. Mr. Gluba had a lot of statistics and is very proud of "His City".

Sixty four people attended on Friday, including Bettendorf Rotarian, Duncan Cameron. Other guests

were: Tim Heim, guest of Jody Johnston-Mohr, Jerry Cousseus, guest of Jim Smith and Kevin Kellums, guest of Adam Kerns.

Kim Wilkins and James Patten encouraged people to come to the Kite Festival the next weekend and Charlie Jones asked for workers for the upcoming Hawkeye games. Kellie Esters gave an update on the October 8 membership drive and Jeremy Kaiser announced the Youth Harvest Party will be at the Pride of the Wapsi pumpkin patch on Wednesday, October 20.

Jim Koehler gave an update on the auction and thanked the members for all the help he is receiving. The 50/50 drawing was \$89 and was won by Linda Frederiksen. John Maxwell told about a new idea for the auction for a pie baking contest. Lisa had delivered a fresh blueberry pie to peak interest. It was sold to the Burt Chiropractic Clinic for \$90.
