We handed out around 350 balloons Sat. and Sun. Jim Koehler helped me on Sat. until we got rained out around 2:00. We handed out about 150 balloons. Sunday Anita Wubbena, Margo and her husband Chad, and Sheila Volrath and daughter helped hand out another 150 balloons until we ran out of helium about 1:00. We decided not to get more, but in retrospect could easily have handed out another 100 balloons (100 balloons/tank). I handed out another 40-50 balloons to kids without blowing up the rest of the afternoon. The balloons were a big hit. It was great exposure for our club and Rotary International. We definitely want to do this again. It was great to see all the balloons leaving the site during the day. We bought helium at the Card and Party Store. \$40.00/tank of approximately 100 balloons/ tank. I bought ribbon to tie to the balloons also. This had to be some of the best public exposure we'll ever get for the money. We should have approx. 650 balloons left for another project. Cost per balloon was probably around \$.55 for everything.

## RIVERBOAT REFERENDUM

September 24, 2010

Mary Ellen Chamberlin, President of Riverboat Development Authority, along with Mo Hyder and Aleshia Chiesa from Rhythm City Casino gave an interesting program on keeping gaming in Scott County. Every eight years Iowa law requires counties that have a gaming facility to hold a public measure on whether to continue to allow gaming. On November 2<sup>nd</sup> voters in Scott County will be asked to vote yes or no to continue to allow gaming.

If the public measure passes, gaming will continue. If it fails, the Isle Casino Hotel and Rhythm City Casino will be forced to close. If this were to happen, over 770 jobs would be eliminated, millions of annual charitable grants would cease to exist and local governments would be left with a budget hole.

Since 1991, \$106 million in grants have been awarded to museums, parks and recreation facilities, public safety, education and health services by the RDA and Scott County Regional Authority.

Sixty two people were present on Friday, with only one guest, Brian Sherrick, guest of Cody Allen. Dorothy White was welcomed back and received a "Brownie Sundae" for her birthday. Presiding as president, Becky Bray told her it was OK to eat dessert first!

John Maxwell auctioned off a fresh, warm peach pie to Serge for a mere \$140. He mentioned that his little daughter, Veronica, was turning 2, so the pie must have been for her. Glen Keppy was the lucky winner of the 50/50 auction pot of money and received \$90. Eric Langan was the sergeant and collected \$27 in fines and \$50 for the education fund in honor of Dorothy's return.

A lot of important Rotary items are coming up in October, including Special Olympics Bowling Skills on October 8 and another Youth Harvest Party at the Wapsi on October 20. And of course the auction on October 28 and three more Hawkeye games. There are plenty of functions to volunteer for! Just check out the calendar of events for all the details.
