PAUL E. HELLWEGE

"GUARDIAN OF INTEGRITY" AWARD

This award is named for Boone Rotarian and Past District Governor (1954-55), Judge Paul E. Hellwege, who passed away in 2010, and is established to promote the ideals of ethics and integrity, which were Paul's fervent passions.

The award will be presented annually to a Rotarian in D6000 who has been a member for a minimum of three years who exemplifies the attributes and passion for ethics and integrity in his or her vocation, business and personal life that Paul exemplified.

This award recognizes an individual who has made outstanding contributions that foster the development of integrity. The award singles out a person who has made contributions in business, media, academia or government and who has by his or her actions, writing,

policies and public pronouncements strengthened and fostered development of integrity and ethical practices. Special consideration will be given to members who have made sacrifices and/or undertaken risks to uphold Rotary's Core Value of Integrity.

Although there will be only one award winner at the District level, a nomination by a club in and by itself is a significant recognition and should be treated as such.

The Guardian of Integrity Selection Committee shall choose the recipient from the individual Rotarians nominated by the Rotary clubs in D6000 (one per club).

The North Scott Rotary Club will take nominations until November 19 and the Board of Directors will select its candidate at the December board meeting.

MARK SMITH: Director of Hand-in-Hand

Mark Smith is the director of the Hand in Hand program in Bettendorf. This is a nonprofit organization that serves children from ages 6 weeks to 21 years who have special needs. The programs are made possible because of the support of the community. Individuals, corporate and foundation support, in addition to United Way Funding provide funding for this program.

The concept was made possible by two sets of parents who had special needs children. Mark & Vinnie Smith and Dave & Joanie Steil wanted more activities in the Quad Cities for their children. Unfortunately the Steil's were not able to realize their dream, as their daughter Tessa, passed away in 1999. They started out with a one week summer camp and now provide services year round.

Mark's own son has autism. It is hard to even go to the grocery store for some families with children with special needs. The group has been in place since his son was 10. Special needs children never receive a text message or a phone call from friends. The Inspiration Studio is an art studio that helps the special needs children create art projects. They look forward to these learning experiences. Some of these projects are for sale.

Hand-in-Hand works closely with the UP with Families group, the Sparkles cheerleaders at Pleasant Valley schools and the Handicapped Development Center.

Fifty eight people attended on Friday, with only one guest, Lori Rochau, guest of Dennis Peterson. Kelly Meyer was the sergeant and had people write captions on the funny man with flowered boxer shorts. She collected \$10 in fines. Mike Auliff won the last 50/50 drawing of \$85. Rob White purchased this week's blueberry pie for \$100. Jeremy Kaiser thanked his Harvest Party committee and thanked them and the club for all the help at the Wapsi in Wednesday.
