Chris Presson, President Quad City Mallards
Sixty eight members and guests were present on December 3 to hear an outstanding presentation about the Mallards Hockey Team. New president, Chris Presson from Wichita, Kansas, was full of various information about the team, the arena, the structure of the leagues, the fans and his extensive experience in managing baseball, hockey and other leadership roles.

Chris spent 15 years working with the minor league hockey teams and was named CHL executive of the year in 1998 and again in 2004. One of his main jobs is to once again fill the seats at each hockey game. Today only about 4000 seats are sold out of 16,000 available. He has 3 years to restore the Mallards. The market is challenging, but he loves his job and welcomes the challenge.

Randy Zobrist announced that his son should be home for Christmas from Afghanistan. He donated \$20 to the education fund. Linda Frederickson also donated \$20 as she welcomes another granddaughter into the family. Pastor Rob Miltenberger was back

in attendance and donated \$10 for his absence and to better health for his daughter. Dr. Anita was the sergeant and collected \$89 in fines as she told everyone to get out a dollar and lay it down if they appreciated the service men and women, appreciated their health, food and families.

December birthdays were celebrated and \$16 collected for cake. President Charlie Jones encouraged members to attend the Q.C. area meeting on Monday, December 13 at the iWireless center. Jody told about the holiday party at the Hotel Blackhawk and asked everyone to sign up by December 10.
