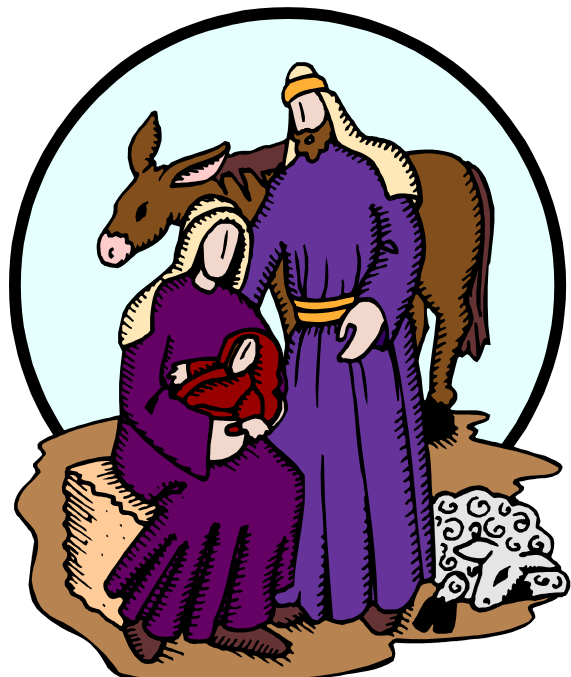

North Scott High School, December, 5, 2010

Vocal Music: Nancy Schmidt

This year's vocal music honoree is a lifelong music lover who was a vocal music teacher for 26 years at Neil Armstrong Elementary School in Park View. Outside the classroom, she was a regular attendee of fine arts concerts at North Scott – in addition to the many athletic endeavors of her children!

Her gentle spirit and manner belie the fact that she is an accomplished pianist who has used her talent to advance the performing arts, and music appreciation, for generations of students. During the school day, you can find her accompanying for the Junior High choir and musical.

For many years, she has traveled with students – and accompanied them – at small group contests. She has also lent her talents to Park View Lutheran Church, where she is the church organist. Nancy and her husband, Keith, are no strangers to North Scott, having given lives of service to our community in numerous ways. They are parents of Lynn Dolan, a medical doctor in Brookfield, Wis., Melanie McMurrin, a teacher associate and soon-to-be physical therapy assistant in Cedar Falls, and Eric, an environmental teacher in Colorado.

Drama: Trish Reisener

The recipient of the theatre award is a community member who has assisted with many North Scott productions and is known for her infectious laugh that the directors and students always appreciated. Her career with performing arts began when she was 12 years old and directed a play from "Jack and Jill" magazine – and cast herself in the lead role!

She was in plays in junior high and a Thespian in high school at Washington, Iowa. She continued her education at the University of Iowa where she obtained a bachelor of arts degree in English education and a master of arts in counseling, and played bagpipes with the Scottish Highlanders.

During 12 years when she taught at Central DeWitt, she did a play and musical every year and once was the director, producer and costumer of a one-woman program! Her more recent claim to fame was at North Scott, where she was a counselor for 19 years, during which time she supported the performing arts in many ways. She was active in the Drama Boosters for many years, including serving as president, and her ties with Lancer Productions began when her daughter, Kara, was a 2-year old in the chorus for "The King and I."

She would prove to be an invaluable person behind the scenes, making costumes for countless shows and speech events, including 12 famous jackets for "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat." She was also instrumental in helping North Scott host and feed 800 students and chaperones for the Iowa State Thespian Festival. She has been active in the Music Boosters and sings in the choir at Eldridge United Methodist Church.

She is also known for bringing Paris, the therapy dog, into the lives of students and staff, and now during her retirement from education she is making dogs more beautiful as a dog groomer with the Teagardens. Trish is married to Jesse Medina and is the mother of Kara and Amy Maxwell.

Instrumental Music, Writing: Shirley Davis

For just the second time since the Fine Arts Awards were begun, we have a double winner, this time for instrumental music and creative writing. Our honoree has excelled at both, using her talents to bring out the best in others. She has been one of the most beloved and widely read journalists in the Quad Cities for 53 years – more than half a century.

For 51 years she was a writer, photographer and traveler with the *Quad-City Times* whose subjects included a literal "Who's Who" of national celebrities. For the past two years, her "Out and About" column in *The North Scott Press* has put the spotlight on music and fine arts locally as well as nationally, including high praise for the North Scott Jazz Band and a favorable comparison of Countryside Community Theatre's production of "Annie" with performances of the same show on Broadway – a venue where she attended shows hundreds of times.

She has been a supporter of the jazz program at North Scott as a regular fixture more than 20 years at our fall jazz concerts with the Northern Illinois Jazz Ensemble and at our spring jazz concert which features all of the North Scott jazz bands and our many guest artists.

The North Scott community is lucky that this iconic writer who has traveled and written about the world – literally – is interested and involved with the arts locally. During her extraordinary career, Shirley was a regular attendee of New York Fashion Shows and the Miss America Pageant where she made friends instantly and told the stories of everyone from the rich and famous to the man or woman across the street.

For many years she corresponded regularly and on a personal level with Ann Landers, and the late, great advice columnist is but one of 200 or more celebrities with whom she is on a first-name basis. Yet, it is Shirley's down home friendliness and charm – together with her husband, Bill Homrighausen – that wins hearts and minds wherever they go. Shirley is always there to lift up and celebrate the successes of others.

Educational institutions see a rise in enrollment when economic times are down. Companies tighten their belts, lay off people, and they return to school. Ashford is doing well and has recently purchased the Best Western Motel in Clinton to use as housing. They also purchased a former country club and have 17 intercollegiate sports teams. They offer online courses and partner with Eastern Iowa Community College, to transfer all credits for students. Ashford embraces making education affordable.
