He received a lot of grief over the scarf, because it was the colors of the losing soccer team in Turkey. It became a joke among the other travelers and it showed up regularly in the pictures.

In one home where they stayed, the bed was a wooden

pallet. A heater in the room was perched on a pile of blankets. He showed a new "green" farm machine, which left 7 people unemployed. The ones that do not finish school will most likely become Sheppard's (if they are lucky). Dick and Shirley rode in a hot air balloon that was designed to hold 22 people. The tour group that they use line up unusual things to do, personal homes to stay in and sometimes they even camp out to save money.
