## Scott Tunnicliff Hilltop Campus Village



Scott Tunnicliff is a native Quad Citian, having been born, raised and schooled in Davenport. He has worked in the field of economic development for over 25 years, first with the QC Development Group, then as Executive Director of the Ottumwa (IA) Area Development Corporation and then for many years as President/CEO of the Bettendorf Chamber of Commerce.

His journey has taken him from land surveying as a young man to industrial site selection, small business assistance, legislative advocacy, transportation initiatives and business-education

partnerships. Since August 2009 he has been the Program Director for the Hilltop Campus Village, a not for profit organization dedicated to revitalization, restoration, and redevelopment of one of Davenport's key Urban Commercial Districts.

He is a graduate of the University of Iowa, and received his M.B.A. from St. Ambrose University. He also graduated from the U. S. Chamber of Commerce's Institute of Organizational Management at Notre Dame University.

Marcia Brandt received points from Don Brandt and Nancy Case, Angela Reese and Adam Kerns all received enough points from Scott Case to receive their first Paul Harris award. Thank you Don and Scott for your generosity!

Jack Schinckel announced that he has a new grandson and Glen Keppy, Paul Kalainoff and Dennis Peterson all have new granddaughters. Don Brandt said that he has been a great grandpa for a few weeks now. Jack, Dennis & Don added \$140 to the education fund in honor of these babies.

Dr. Arthur Tate was the speaker on Friday and has a big job ahead of him as the leader of Davenport Schools. He started the job last July and loves spending 2-3 hours every day in the classrooms. He says that interacting with the students, keeps him young. He took the position, coming from Tempe, AZ, at age 71. Of course his big challenge is the budget. He has several things in mind such as eliminating an assistant principal at each high school, shutting down Lincoln Elementary School and working on the transportation system. 60 per cent of the

15,000 students in the Davenport schools are on the free and reduced lunch program. Poverty leads to a higher drop out rate. If the children do not have adequate food and the proper clothing, it is difficult to excel in school.

Dr. Tate is currently a member of the Davenport morning Kiwanis club. He is a former Rotarian and is familiar with polio, as a friend of his suffered with the disease. Bill Tubbs announced on Friday that as of January 13, no new cases of polio have appeared in India for a whole year. Bill is going on the upcoming trip to India to immunize the children with Polio vaccine. He will be gone several days in February.

Becky encouraged members to help with the Elderly project, Special Olympics and Rotary Reads at John Glenn Elementary School. Dr. Anita told about the Valentine Event coming up. Jim Koehler is glad to be celebrating his 73<sup>rd</sup> Birthday this weekend and encouraged everyone to have regular medical checkups.

Randy Zobrist was the sergeant and collected \$24 in fines with his interesting "snow" trivia contest. Anita Grove is home and will be recovering from her car accident for several months. Charlotte White passed away; her funeral is Saturday, Jan. 21.
