Rotary Friends,

Feb. 17, 2012: This was an incredible day that will make this trip more than worth the time and trouble regardless of anything else we see or do. In a visit to St. Stephens Hospital, we had the extraordinary privilege to see and hear from the medical staff who are God's hands and feet ministering to polio patients whose bodies and spirits have been broken by this crippling disease. All in our group of 37 were visibly moved, some to tears, upon seeing the work of Dr. Mathew Vargese and the staff who repair those bodies under the most amazing of conditions and restore a sense of dignity. But the images of the disfigured limbs will be with me always. And then we went to the ward and saw

the children who greeted us with smiles despite their inability to do most of the things that our children and grandchildren take for granted. It was so humbling and renewed our resolve to finish the task of eradicating this scourge to humanity. The evil that polio brings upon children is so wrong, and what Rotary is doing is so right! Later, we were guests of the Rotary Club of Delhi Midtown, where the leaders of the Indian National Polio Committee and World Health Organization presented the latest information. This Sunday's NID will visit 209 million homes to immunize 174 million children and will involve: 709,000 vaccination booths, 2,500,000 vaccinators, 1,170,000 vaccination teams, 155,000 supervisors with 155,000 vehicles (cars, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, boats, elephants, camels or whatever it takes), 225 million doses of polio vaccine carried around the country in 2 million vaccine carrier bags, and 6.3 million ice packs to keep those doses of polio vaccine cold. The good news is that Rotary and its partners (WHO, Unicef, CDC) are winning! No new cases in India since Jan. 13, 2011. But, they add, "We are not celebrating - this is just a milestone. Actually, we are going to be more aggressive." Polio crossed the border into China last year with 21 cases, so nobody is taking anything for granted. In an operation this size, so much can still go wrong, but there is reason for optimism and there are many stories to tell to create awareness as we must. I just hope I can be an adequate messenger. My memory card is filling up and my notebook is half full but much lies ahead. Tonight we attend the Rotary Club of Delhi South West and tomorrow we visit two more Rotary project sites -- the "Rotary Health Camp" and "Gift of Life." Then on Sunday we will be part of the National Immunization Day and Monday we go "house to house" to mop up the immunization campaign. I'll see many of you in Iowa shortly. Keep the faith and Reach Within to Embrace Humanity!
