Our project for helping the elderly poor is making a difference for those who cannot afford to have labor and supplies for safety issues in their homes. We are partnering with Generations Agency on Aging to supply and install safety bars in bathrooms and assist with railings for help on stairs. This is being done with a District Simplified Grant that has allowed us to purchase the items for those who can't afford them. Some of the elderly have had relatives who were able to install the items. Others have helped purchase some things but are too old to install themselves. All volunteers are covered for liability by Rotary and by the Generations Agency. We continue to get some requests for help and need Rotarians to help with the visits and work. These elderly qualify for assistance because of their level of income. Those who have received our help have been extremely grateful. Generations Agency on Aging assures us that this has made a huge difference. Some of their funding for this type of assistance is no longer available so without us this year, this work would not be possible. Thanks to those who have helped.
