I was born on October 7th, 1995 in Vechta, a little town near my home town, where I lived my whole life, called Ahlhorn. Ahlhorn is in the North West of Germany, near cities like Bremen (1h away) and Hamburg (2h). My parents are Volker Görtz-Teplinski (65) who used to be an engineer for AEG and Angelika Teplinski (54) who used to be a secretary for a lawyer. My mom now works with handicapped people and people with special needs since she wanted to try something new and help people around her, my dad is retired since this year. I have an older brother, Sebastian (19) who is currently a senior at the GAG Oldenburg.

When I was 3 years old i went to Kindergarten in Ahlhorn and while in Kindergarten I started playing soccer. After Kindergarten, when I was 6 years old, I visited the elementary school in Ahlhorn and went there for the next 4 years. After long discussions my parents and I made the decision to send me to the Liebfrauenschule, which is a catholic private school in Cloppenburg, a neighbor city. I was in 7th grade, I think, when I switched my soccer teams from the Ahlhorner SV to the SC Sternbusch. With attending the school in Cloppenburg part of my life was transferred there. I have my friends there, I go to school there and then I decided I wanted to play soccer there, too. That was a great decision! I am very active in Soccer now. I pretty much have played my whole life and it has become a very important part of me. When I don't play soccer I hang out with my friends most of the time.

I always wanted to be an exchange student. Since my family has a camper I have been in almost every country in Europe now. I have seen a lot of different cultures, different food, music and ways to dress. But I wanted more, I wanted to spend one year somewhere in the world, go to school there and meet new people and find new friends. I arrived here in the USA last year in August and now I have 4 months left. So far it was really interesting and I met a lot of new people and made new friends.
