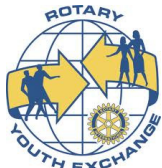
Last Week

Name: Fumika - girl
Country: Japan
Age: 16

Fumika is a 16-year-old girl from Japan. She and her younger brother have been raised by their father. At school she is taking 14 subjects that are: science, modern society, world history, English, physical education, elective gym, art (calligraphy), home economics computers and integrated study. Each class is 50 minutes long. Each evening after dinner she does her homework before going to bed

At school she is a member of the discipline committee. Her father manages a restaurant where he is the chef. The city where she lives has a population of 94,000. Her father drives her to school each day.

She likes to snow ski. She has practiced the Japanese tea ceremony, the art of calligraphy and koto, the thirteen string musical instrument since she was 10 years old. She says that practicing calligraphy improves her concentration and calms her mind.

She is an average student. She wants to improve her English and to learn more about America's culture. Though she is shy, she wants to make many friends during her exchange year.

Name: Rafaella - girl
Country: Brazil
Age: 17 in July

Rafaella is from a city in Brazil that has a population of approximately 53,000. She lives in an apartment. She has a younger sister. Her parents both work.

Rafaella studies 12 subjects each semester. She is currently studying math, Portuguese, geography, history, chemistry, physics, physical education, biology, sociology, philosophy, art and English. Her English skills appear to be adequate. Her teacher's recommendation is that she has the facility to learn other languages.

Rafaella has traveled within Brazil alone but has not traveled abroad. She wants to learn more about other cultures but admits that she is proud to be a Brazilian. She plays basketball and enjoys other sports.

Her parents state that she is very disciplined on issues of interests. She does have a strong personality but respects and accepts rules. Rafaella is enthusiastic, cheerful and loyal to her friends. She learned about Youth Exchange from her cousins

Name: Paula - girl
Country: Spain
Age: 16 in September

Paula is from a major city in Spain. She is 15 years old and has two younger siblings, both sisters. Both of her parents are entrepreneurs. Her father is a Rotarian but not her mother.

In school Paula is taking 8 classes every day. Paula has chosen the science track to study in high school instead of the humanities or arts. She studies Spanish literature, English, French, math, history, biology, geology, physics, chemistry, music, computers and ethics. Paula plays the violin and she plays in the orchestra.

When she goes to school in the morning her parents drive she and her sisters. In the afternoon they walk home. Everyone studies in a common room. They eat their meals in the evening and afterward Paula studies some more before going to bed.

Paula likes to hang out with her friends at the cinema, go shopping or sit at one their homes watch TV.

Paula and her family have traveled a great deal. They have been to Paris, Miami, Mexico, Milan, the Caribbean and many other destinations. Her trips to the United States have included Las Vegas, Los Angeles and San Francisco. She always tries to improve her conversational English.
