Mary Agnoli NS Rotary Exchange Student To Trieste, Italy

I am not exaggerating when I say that Rotary International has changed my life, and the funny part is that two years ago I wasn't even aware that the organization existed. My journey with Rotary started my sophomore year when I was nominated to take part in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA). It was there that I learned about leadership, myself, and the Rotary Youth Exchange Program. I initially thought that STEP or the Short Term Exchange Program, which lasted a month, was the right fit for me. However, after the first meeting with all of the inbound and outbound students, I came home saying: "I want to go for the full year." To this day I am not sure how I was able to switch to the Long Term program half way through the process, complete my required high school credits for graduating the summer before departing, and spend the next 8 ½ months in Trieste, Italy.

Throughout my exchange I can honestly say I've had both the best and worst moments of my life, the most difficult and the most rewarding, the most frustrating and the most fulfilling, and had the opportunity to teach and learn about the differences among cultures. I had the opportunity to travel to more countries in those eight months than in my almost 18 years of life. I became completely immersed in a new culture and a new language. I discovered a new family while thousands of miles away from my own. I grew in ways that words cannot fully describe. Thanks to Rotary, and to the North Scott and Trieste North Rotary Clubs in particular, I have had all of these opportunities. I cannot begin to thank

each and every one of you enough for having made this possible for me and for all of the other past, present, and future exchange students.
