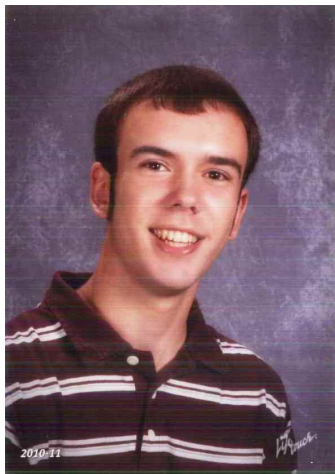

Meeting Notes: Dr. Ann
O'Donnell – Hospice Care

Deb Hughes arranged for Dr. Ann O'Donnell, Medical Director of Hospice for the Genesis Hospitals, to speak at Rotary last Friday. Sixty members attended, along with Davenport Rotarian, Ralph Henniger, and Mary Ann Meyers, also from Genesis.

Dr. O'Donnell has been the director of Hospice for Genesis for nine years. Most hospice patients are on Medicare. Hospice is a special type of care for people facing serious illness and who may have a limited life expectancy of 6 months or less, if the disease runs its normal course. Patients can receive Hospice care in various environments, even their own home. This includes Visiting Nurses Service for skilled services or Hospice Services.

Hospice Care began in the 1970'S. It was initially a service provided for only cancer patients. Now it includes a greater variety of disease management. Comfort for each patient is the goal. Everyone is treated as if their life is extraordinary. Vast assortments of other services are offered at the

Hospice centers, such as music therapy, massage therapy, foot reflexology and others.
