James Patten, founder and organizer for the Quad Cities Family Fun & Kite Festival has found his passion for kites through teaching others to build, fly and enjoy kites.

Kites are one of, if not the oldest toys and show up throughout every culture on the globe. The official origin is still unknown but it is assumed that kites are over 5000 year old. Many cultures have used kites as tools to hoist other objects. The bridge at Niagara Falls owes its

existence to a kite that was used to span the 800-foot wide gap. In early 1900's Samuel Franklin Cody hoisted people up for military spotting and mapping. Cameras are still hoisted up for photography as well as many other purposes.

The Quad Cities Family Fun & Kite Festival has been put together to bring kites to the QC kids of all ages. With Free kids kite building, kite battles, bol races, giant show kites and stunt kite performances covering many aspects of kites. The Festival brings together other youth and family organizations and provides vending opportunities for businesses.

James was born in Cedar Rapids, Ia and grew up mostly in eastern Iowa. He is a graduate of the University of Northern Iowa and St Ambrose University's Masters of Organizational Leadership. Currently serves as Vice President of WLi, a performance improvement firm that his father started in 1996. He currently lives in Davenport IA with his wife, Jenifer and daughter, Maggie.
