# Salvation Army of the Quad Cities

The Salvation Army of the Quad Cities' largest Social Service Program is the Family Service Center located in downtown Davenport. The program housed 150 adults and their 187 children last year. This photo shows the faces of just 30 of those precious children.

The program seeks to assist the residents' development towards job stability and meaningful integration into the community as they find permanent housing. People who reside at the Family Service Center include: single women, pregnant women, single mothers with children; and we are the only shelter in the Quad Cities that can house single fathers with children and two-parent families, including lawfully married same-sex parents. There are two housing programs:

The emergency shelter program provides shelter and meals to people facing homelessness. This is a 90-day program with requirements. Clients must actively search for work unless there are young children to care for or other obstacles that make working impossible. Residents are required to meet weekly with their caseworker to discuss responsibilities and goals. Caseworkers provide community agency referrals, landlord advocacy, coordinate life skills and nutrition classes and monitor resident's efforts to find permanent housing. Caseworkers also provide guidance or referrals in employment, assist clients in saving up to 70% of their income for future rent, solving family problems, obtaining counseling for substance abuse, domestic violence and mental health issues. Homelessness is usually only one of many

issues.

The transitional housing program provides families with a complete apartment with a full kitchen at a sliding-scale rent for up to two years. In order to qualify for this housing, applicants must have one of the following: mental disability, physical disability, substance abuse recovery, or be homeless. At least one adult must have a job, up to 30% of the family's income needs to be saved, and their children must stay in school. Families are able to use this time to repair their credit or pay-off old utility debts, provide stability to the children, and take advantage of our case workers' expertise in dealing with issues in their lives.

The Salvation Army is not ashamed to say "we cannot do this alone." We are asking for your help, because we know that motivated people will transform their lives and get themselves on the road to self-sufficiency if they have the tools to do it. Our program will give them the tools. We'll explain some of the ways you can help us at the meeting today. Thank you, Major Gary Felton, Quad Cities Coordinator

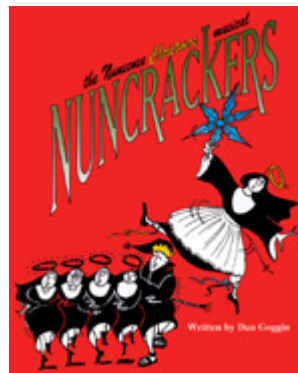
