Salvation Army of QC

Major Gary Felton and his media assistant, Holly Nomura, was the program at Rotary on Friday. Gary has only been in the Quad Cities for one year. Previous to that, his assignments took him to Green Bay, Wisconsin and Jamaica.

The Family Service Center at 301 W. 6th Street, Davenport, is the only QC shelter that offers help for intact 2 parent families, same sex 2 parent families and single fathers with children. Other clients served are single mothers with children. The shelter holds 100 people. They feed between 80-130 people each day, at the Community Meal site. No noon meal is served and also no meals on Sundays.

Clients are not allowed to stay at the center during the day. They are expected to be looking for jobs and permanent housing. They are required to bring proof of this back to the resident supervisor. The Bell Ringing project during December brings in some financial aid for their food boxes and toy shop that they operate during that season.

Sixty people were in attendance on Friday, including visiting Rotarians, Todd Ashby from Bettendorf club, and Mike Hamann & Don Doucette from the Davenport Club. Other guests were Mary Lou Engler, guest of Bill Tubbs, Joan Richards, guest of John Maxwell and Nathan Kessler, guest of Pete Wislander.

Steve Fahrenkrog was the winner of \$98 in the 50/50 auction drawing. Pies this week sold for \$100 to Dennis Peterson and \$125 to Teresa Paper. Lanyards were down this week with one to Merle Anderson for \$10 and Ken Tank for \$25. Birthdays were celebrated with \$25 collected for the cake and fines collected by John Maxwell of \$30.

Mike Hamann, president of the Davenport Club, invited everyone to their 100 year celebration on November 11. (See details on the calendar). The North Scott Rotary Club is one of many clubs that the Davenport club has sponsored.
