Dr. Don Doucette - Chancellor Eastern Iowa Community College

Dr. Donald Doucette became Chancellor of the Eastern Iowa Community College District (EICCD) on July 1. As chancellor, he oversees the operations of the entire eastern Iowa district including Clinton, Muscatine and Scott Community Colleges.

Dr. Doucette previously served as Senior Vice President and Provost of Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana. Ivy Tech Community College is a statewide community college with 29 campuses and more than 290,000 students. As chief operating officer for the college, Dr. Doucette's responsibilities included leadership of the

college's academic programs, student services, instructional technology and online education, as well as leadership and coordination of the college's 14 administrative regions.

His major accomplishments at Ivy Tech included successfully managing 50 percent enrollment growth over three years, redesigning the college's budget and strategic planning processes, achieving a 10-year regional re-accreditation and implementing Achieving the Dream to focus on increasing student completion.

Prior to coming to Ivy Tech, Dr. Doucette served as Vice Chancellor for Education and Technology for the Metropolitan Community Colleges of Kansas City, MO, a five-college community college district.

Previously, he served in various leadership, administrative and teaching roles for the League for Innovation in the Community College; Johnson County Community College, Overland Park, Kansas; Maricopa County Community College District, Phoenix, Arizona; and the University of Missouri-Kansas City. He also led the establishment of the first community college in Haiti, the Business and Technology Institute in Les Cayes, Haiti, and currently serves as president of its board.

Born and raised in Salem, MA, Dr. Doucette earned his Ph.D. in Higher Education from Arizona State University, his M.A. in English and his B.A. in English from Cornell University. He has been married for 33 years to Lynn Drazinski, a speech and language therapist and faculty member at Rockhurst University in Kansas City, Missouri. They have three children: Emily, 26, Meredith, 24, and Daniel, 23.

Student from Vigo, Spain

Mikel Ursua Alonso is North Scott Rotary's exchange student (son) and is spending this year with Scott and Dixie Kurtz. He is attending Bettendorf High School and preparing for the Basketball season. Mikel is no stranger to Iowa or the Kurtz family. He spent a month with the Kurtz family in both 2009 and 2010. After several stressful weeks and setbacks, we finally got Mikel safely to Iowa and enrolled in school, last August.

Mikel gave the club an excellent presentation on Friday about his home, family and activities in Spain. The climate averages 75 degrees, so of course Mikel is freezing in this weather. He lives just a short distance from the Atlantic Ocean and Portugal. The water is very important to the industry in his area. Vigo is the largest fishing port in Europe and also has a lot of ship construction. Galician seafood is famous in his home area. Mikel however, does not care for seafood. He showed pictures of the large swordfish and other varieties of fresh fish for sale, lying on long boards. Buyers come bid everyday for the fresh catch.

Spain also has a professional soccer team, which is very popular. Many nice beaches and beautiful mountains are nearby. Peugeot automobiles are manufactured in Vigo

and 545,000 of them were shipped from Spain a few years ago.

Seventy people total attended on Friday. Student guests were present from Davenport North, Assumption and North Scott High Schools. Also attending was former member of NSR and current member of the Waverly Rotary club, Rev. Bob Holdorf.
