Paul Rumler is the Executive Vice President of the Quad Cities Chamber of Commerce, which serves the Illinois and Iowa Quad Cities region. Through the Chamber, Paul helps lead many Community and Economic Development initiatives to grow the region's economy. He also serves as the Executive Director for the Quad Cities Passenger Rail Coalition, which is a Chamber-led initiative working to re-establish passenger rail service to the Quad Cities.

Prior to the Quad Cities Chamber, Paul was active in political and governmental affairs. He worked for various Members of Congress in Washington, DC, including the past US House Majority Leader Steny Hoyer. Paul began his career as a Legislator Director in the Massachusetts State Senate and more recently, Paul was a candidate for Illinois State Senate.

Paul was recently honored in 2011 as a Quad Cities "Leader Under 40" by the Black Hawk College Foundation.

Don Doucette is new to the Quad Cities as Chancellor of the Eastern Iowa Community College campus locations. Teresa Paper was proud to introduce him and also the four other guests that she had present from EICC. Don is from a Polish family that worked several generations in the leather and sweater factories. Don and his sisters realized that they needed to have a college education to not continue down the same path.

Don has worked for 34 years as an administrator of a community college. 23 years have been spent in the Midwest, although this job is his first job in Iowa. He is married to Lynn, also a Polish girl, who is on staff at Rockhurst University in Kansas City. They have three children.

EICC has 15,000 credit students and 30,000 non credit students. Dr. Doucette is striving to increase revenue and support economic development in his position at EICC. He encourages students to get a college education, as many jobs require at least a two year degree.

Don also has a great passion for the people in Haiti. He serves as president of the board of the first community college in the country, which he started. He travels there

2-3 times per year, which started in 2001, when he went to build benches. He fell in love with the children's bright eyes. He has been there 35 times since 2001. After the earth quake, he took mental health experts with him. His children have travelled with him and have been influenced by the great amount of help the people of Haiti need.

Teresa Paper presented Merle and Mary Lou Anderson with Paul Harris Awards. It was Merle's fifth and he surprised Mary Lou with one, obtained from the points he has accumulated. Scott Kurtz gave \$50 to the educational fund, as he told of all Mikel's adventures this past week, attending a Hawkeye Football game, picking corn at Maxwell's farm and following the Bettendorf football team to the state tournament.

Dr. Anita was the sergeant and collected \$74 in fines. She read a tribute to all Veterans and asked all to donate a dollar.
