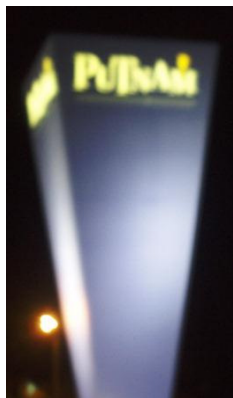

HOLIDAY PARTY 2012 PUTNAM MUSEUM

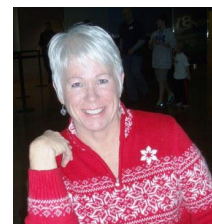

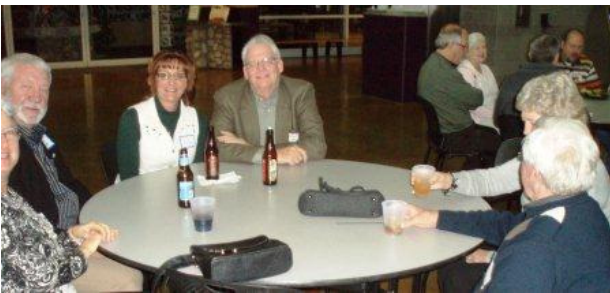
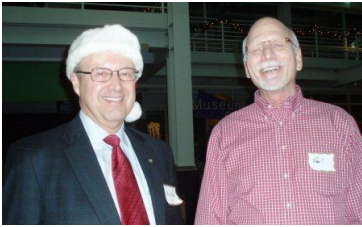
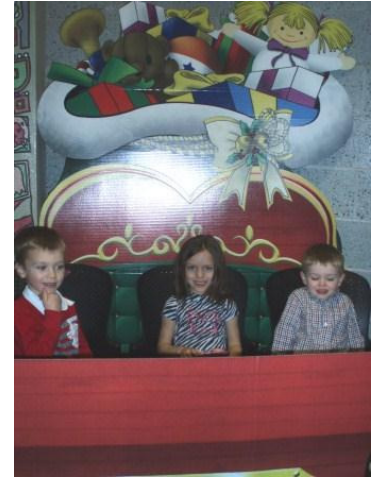
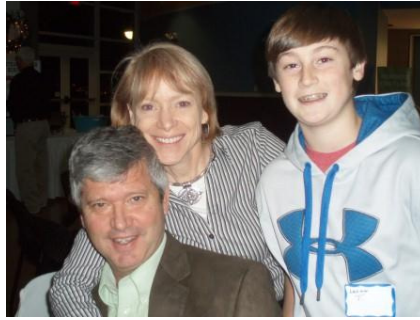
Dinner was created and served by the Culinary Kids a division program of Family Resources.

Merle Anderson is a member of the club below and asked to have this included in a newsletter. Past President Carl Stigdon is also Wagon Master Head in Florida.

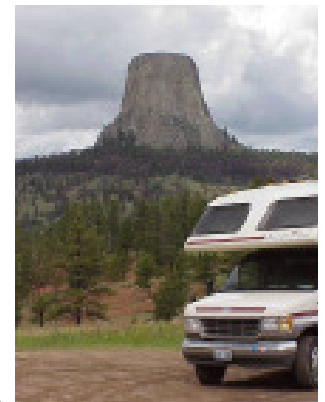
RECREATIONAL VEHICLE FELLOWSHIP OF ROTARIANS, N.A.
