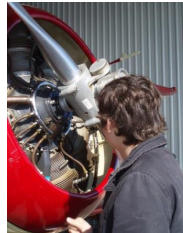
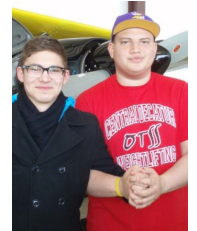

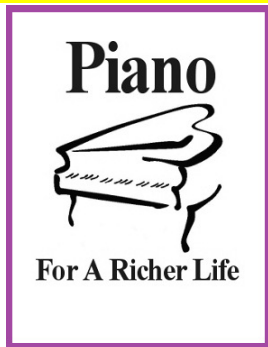

Piano Celebration is a local charity event that takes place every third weekend in April, in the Quad Cities of Iowa and Illinois, at [Northpark Mall](#) in [Davenport](#). The event features celebrity pianists, high-achieving student pianists, piano teacher studios, living room performers, musicians and vocalists.
