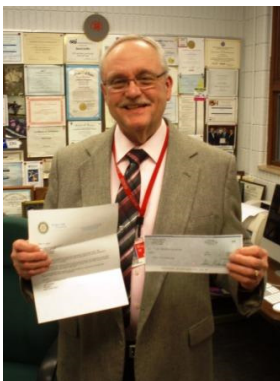

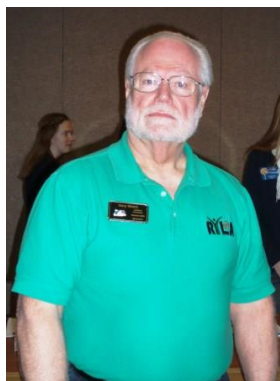
#### Scott Community College Scholarship
