### Rotary Paul Hellwege Guardian of Integrity Award



North Scott Rotary has again nominated a special individual for this prestigious award. We have nominated Merle Anderson. John Maxwell's nomination letter sums it up very well.

A few years ago, Merle Anderson gave a program at my Rotary club about the county of Moldova. It was very interesting and he really spoke with great passion.

Last year I had the opportunity to go to Moldova and follow in Merle's footsteps. WOW what an impact he has had in that country. His mission has been to create a milk cooperative that would collect the milk from the farmers, process it and then sell it to the consumer in the grocery store. Prior to Merle the cows were milked by hand and milk was sold locally, unpasteurized. There were many problems with the quality of the milk and the health of the consumer was in put in harms way. Merle started by selecting a manager (Vasile Gheorghe). In 1998 he brought him to the United States to show him what the possibilities could be. As Vasile said "It allowed me to dream of what I could become." In 2001 Merle and Vasile convinced 12 villages to start selling milk to them for processing. According to Vasile, that was the hardest part because of the lack of trust amongst the former Soviet people. Merle and Vasile worked very hard convincing the people throughout the region to sell their milk to the cooperative. Vita Lact Cooperative today has many milk collection stations throughout Moldova and their label can be found in many stores throughout the country. When I spoke to many of the folks of that country they spoke of Merle in the highest regard. Someone that put service above one's
