New Ground Theatre

Artistic Director Chris Jansen grew up in the Quad Cities and got her theatre degree from the University of Iowa. After college, she worked with The Old Creamery Theatre Co. and helped to found A Theatre of Two Cities in Minneapolis. She received her MFA in playwriting from Brandeis University. While on the east coast, she worked with Playwrights Platform in Boston, Mass., and Trinity Rep. in Providence, RI. Her plays have been produced by West Coast Ensemble in Los Angeles (where her play "Dream A Little Dream of Me" won a DramaLogue Award for Best One-Act), Chapel Hill Chauncey Hall Summer Theatre School, Brandeis University, and the University of Iowa. After returning to the Quad Cities, she founded New Ground Theatre in 2001.

The mission of New Ground Theatre is to bring high quality contemporary and original theatre to the Quad Cities. We intend to discover and nurture local talent and to pay all artists involved. In addition we will target a young adult audience to keep the theatre-going tradition alive.

In fall of 2007 New Ground took up residency in the old Turner Hall in the Village of East Davenport and began its conversion to the Village Theatre. We are using this space as our home base as we work to buy the building. We have made our theatre to other group companies. We also donate our space to various community groups. Since 2010 we have been buying the building on contract.
