Yellow Dot Program

with Scott County Sheriff's office, Deputy Ken Koehler is scheduled for November 16, 2012.

Yellow Dot is a free program designed to help first responders provide life-saving medical attention during that first "golden hour" after a crash or other emergency. A **Yellow Dot** in the driver's-side rear window of your vehicle will alert first responders that vital medical information is stored in the glove compartment.

How Yellow Dot Works

The **Yellow Dot** kit contains a personal information card and a **Yellow Dot** decal.

1. Complete both sides of the personal information card as fully as possible, in pencil. Attach a recent photo of yourself and place it in a visible location in your car's glove compartment.
2. Complete one card for each person who regularly occupies the vehicle. See below to request additional medical information forms.
3. Place the **Yellow Dot** decal on the rear driver's side window to alert first responders to look in the glove compartment for your medical information.
4. Update the card annually yourself or bring it to your annual medical check-up. If you sell your car, remove the **Yellow Dot** sticker.

Use Yellow Dot at Home

A **Yellow Dot** kit can also be used to alert those who respond to an emergency in your home. Simply place a **Yellow Dot** decal on or beside your front door and place a completed card for each occupant in a clear plastic freezer bag and place in a visible location in the freezer compartment of your refrigerator.

MAC sportsmanship awards West, Burlington, North Scott, Pleasant Valley, North win

Five Mississippi Athletic Conference schools are winners of first-place awards for sportsmanship in spring and summer sports, and **Davenport West** and **Burlington** won close races for the best overall sportsmanship for boys' and girls' sports, respectively, for 2011-12. The winners will receive awards sponsored by area Rotary clubs on Nov. 14 at 7:00 p.m. at the fall coaches' and athletic directors' meeting at Bettendorf High School. **North Scott** won first in boys' soccer with a rating of 1.29, and tied for first with **Davenport North** in softball with perfect 1.00 scores for the season for the conduct of coaches, players and fans. **Davenport West** had a perfect 1.00 score to win first for girls' soccer, and **Pleasant Valley** received a near-perfect 1.04 rating to take first for baseball.

The contests for best overall sportsmanship were decided by narrow margins.

Davenport West's 1.20 average for five boys' sports (football, basketball, wrestling, soccer and baseball) edged second-place **North Scott's** 1.21. For **West**, it was the fourth consecutive year and the fifth time in six years that the Falcons have had the best overall rating for boys' sports.

Burlington's 1.165 average for four girls' sports (volleyball, basketball, soccer and softball) bested runner-up **Clinton's** 1.175 and **West's** and **Bettendorf's** 1.18.

The ratings for the conduct of athletes, coaches and fans are turned in after each contest by game officials on the following scale: 1) Outstanding, all positive happenings; 2) Above average, desirable sports climate; 3) Acceptable, mostly positive but not perfect; 4) Needs improvement, some minor negatives; and 5) Unacceptable for high school sports.

Overall, sportsmanship ratings are high in all sports. The average in five boys' sports during 2011-12 was 1.32, and for four girls' sports was 1.24.
