Rotary's 5 Avenues of Service

Club Service: Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the smooth functioning of Rotary Clubs.

Vocational Service: Vocational Service involves club members serving through their professions and aspiring to high ethical standards.

Community Service: Community Service is the opportunity Rotary clubs have to implement club project and activities that improve life in the local community.

International Service: International Service encompasses efforts to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the world and to promote world understanding and peace.

New Generations: Now called Youth Committee: The Avenue of New Generations recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults involved in leadership development activities, community and international service projects, and exchange programs that enrich and foster world peace and cultural understanding.

North Scott Rotary is especially strong in the Youth Committee area: Paul Kalainoff and Dennis Peterson serve on the District 6000 Youth Committee. We have spent 2 weekends this month working with Youth Exchange in training Rotex (returning students) to aid in training of new outbound students. The next weekend was with this years inbound and outbound students in a Retreat at Indianola, Iowa, to aid these students in being ambassadors to the world. Justice Thomas D. Waterman

Justice Waterman, Pleasant Valley, was appointed to the Iowa Supreme Court in 2011.

Justice Waterman, who was born in Davenport, Iowa, earned his bachelor of arts degree from Dartmouth College in 1981. He graduated Order of the Coif from the University of Iowa College of Law in 1984, and served as associate editor of the law review. He was in private practice at Lane & Waterman LLP in Davenport from 1984 until his appointment.

Before joining the court, Justice Waterman was active in numerous organizations including the Jury Instruction Committee of the Iowa State Bar Association, the American College of Trial Lawyers, and the Iowa Academy of Trial Lawyers. He was a member of the State Judicial Nominating Commission from 1999-2005, and was a co-editor of Defense Update, the quarterly publication of the Iowa Defense Counsel Association. An avid endurance sports enthusiast, he has completed seven Ironman triathlons and several ultra-marathons including the Leadville, Colorado 100-mile trail run and the Grand Canyon "Rim to Rim to Rim." His volunteer work included serving as Board Chair for the Scott County Family YMCA and Rivermont Collegiate.

Justice Waterman is married and has four daughters, including triplets. His current term expires December 31, 2020.
