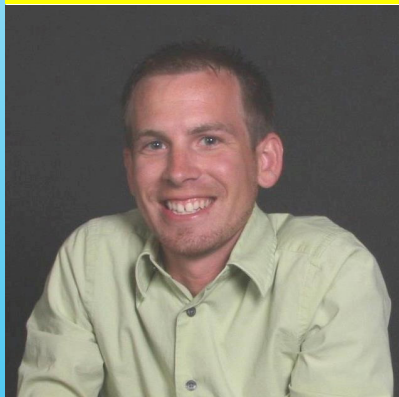
North Scott Rotary Serves
