NORTH SCOTT ROTARY SERVES

The Board of Directors of North Scott Rotary was given a presentation by Merle Anderson and Glen Keppy about their trips to Uganda, and specifically, the work with The Gods Mercy Orphanage In Kisoro, Uganda. Merle & Glen have been working on organizing a Rotary International Grant to aid in the operation of the orphanage to increase its capacity to be able to serve up to 25 students on a full time basis. The Board voted to increase our investment in this project from \$1000 approved last year with an additional \$2000 for a total of \$3000. These grants require a minimum investment of \$7500, which with matching at District and International will become \$35,000. Merle and Glen are making presentations at other Rotary Clubs to ask them to join us in the effort, and are about complete in reaching the minimum needed. More would be better.

At Present the orphanage is operated by three sisters on a property owned by their parents. All of their resources are consumed by this. They now serve 27 children during the day and only four can stay the night. The students currently attend school and are fed during the day. They then spend the nights with other relatives, or more often, the caregivers who work one on one with them on a daily basis at the orphanage.

There are many children that need this care and few spots available.

BIOGRAPHY

Werner Zarnikow was born in Gorlitz Germany in May of 1924 and immigrated to the United States in October of 1925. The family settled in Buffalo, NY where his father's sister lived and which had a large German population. At first German was the language in the home but gradually it turned to English.

He attended Buffalo Technical High School in where he graduated in 1941, majoring in the Building Design and Construction curriculum. In 1942, at the age of 18, Werner enlisted in the US Army Air Corps. He was called to active duty in February of 1943 and was assigned to officer's school and then to flight training as an aviation cadet.

After completing flight training he was assigned to 4-engine bomber and crew training. The crew then went to Europe on the Queen Mary, they then served with the 8th Air Force, based in England, and flew bombing missions over Germany. After the war ended the crew was assigned to bring a plane back to the US. Werner was then assigned to instructor training in Texas, for B-29 bombers, just as the war ended in Japan.

The GI Bill offered him the opportunity for a college education so he enrolled in the architectural curriculum at Iowa State University where he graduated in 1950. That is also where he met his wife who graduated in 1947. Werner started his architectural career in Des Moines where he worked for 24 years and raised 5 children

Health issues took them to California for 8 years where he continued to work until retirement. In 1989 they moved to Arizona and Werner continued to work part-time and had the opportunity to work in France. Health issues and the desire to be closer to family brought them back to Iowa. They settled in Wilton, to be near their oldest daughter and closer to a daughter in Des Moines and a son near Chicago.

LAST MEETING – November 15, 2013 – Glen Keppy: Adventures in Uganda

Glen Keppy finally got to tell about his trip to Uganda in February 2013. Merle Anderson encouraged Glen to continue educating the native Ugandans, where Merle had started coops in previous trips. Glen taught farmers (mostly women) about record keeping and maize (corn) production. He held two weeks of meetings, in various locations, in a church and outside under the trees. Some of the attendees traveled over three hours on foot to attend.

Glen also visited the God's Mercy Orphanage Center. North Scott Rotary is working on an international grant to support this orphanage, along with a few other clubs. North Scott gave \$1000 last year and voted on Friday to give another \$2000 this year.

Sixty eight attended on Friday. Annette Tank was a guest, along with Junior Rotarians, Lucas Golinghorst, Anna Denger, Cindy Chen and Jacob Emmert. Also counselors Tracey Denahy and Tammy Conrad were present. Anna won the Live Uncommon sweatshirt, donated to benefit Mattie Case's Make-A-Wish platform.

Marty O'Boyle thanked the voters of Eldridge for his reelection as mayor and gave \$20 to the education fund. Margo announced the birth of her granddaughter on October 18 and gave \$18 to the education fund. Bill Tubbs was the sergeant and passed the "red bucket" to collect money for the disaster in the Philippines.
