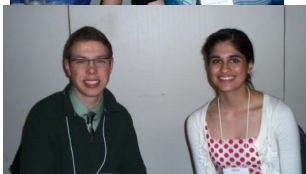

A native of Los Angeles, California, Todd graduated from California State University at Northridge in 1987 with a degree in History. Following graduation, he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Air Force. Throughout his 23 years in service, Todd held a variety of command and educational leadership positions including Head of

School for the largest joint Flight Training School in the Department of Defense and the Air Force Academy Preparatory School from which he retired with the rank of Colonel in 2010. Desiring to teach at an urban public school, Todd served as a Department Chair at North Penn High School in Pennsylvania before assuming his current position as the Headmaster of Rivermont Collegiate in 2013. Degrees held include Master of Arts Degrees in *National Security and Strategic Studies*, *Airpower Arts and Sciences*, *Defense Studies (UK)* and *Humanities*. An avid skier and spouse-diagnosed *sports addict*, Todd and his wife Sheri have been blessed with two children, Brandon (22) and Kate (17).

Our honoree for literature and writing was a 6th-grade teacher at Alan Shepard Elementary School and she and her late husband, Ted, raised their family of five children who are all North Scott grads, when they lived just south of Eldridge at the corner of Buttermilk and Slopertown roads. They are Bill, Jim, Fred and Joe Green, and Pat Beck. Phyllis Green supported the arts in so many ways that she, too, could be honored in several of our categories. Today we are recognizing her for her recent publication of a book of poems entitled "Prepositions." She also recently published a book of Christmas stories, and if it is anything like her poems, it will be a delight to read.

"Teaching 6th grade at North Scott allowed for many opportunities to promote Fine Arts. Administration, fellow teachers, cooperative parents, and great kids gave us opportunities to grow and be creative. The school newspaper, the school song, the in-school broadcasting station, daily journaling, History Day, the World's Fair, nursing home friends, Coats For Kids Campaign, the celebration for the Statue Of Liberty, letters to servicemen, the Great Milk Jug campaign, and many other activities came from busy 6th graders. Our slogan of 'Think globally, act locally!' was more than just a saying for busy 6th graders.

"Our school was presented with one of the first FINE Awards (First In the Nation in Education) given in the state of Iowa. In 1990, our 6th grade was judged 'A Point of Light' by the President of the United States, George H.W. Bush, and congratulated by the Iowa Governor Terry Branstad. The students were honored because of their community involvement."

"Writing has always been a part of my life and I hope passed that on to 6th graders," Phyllis said, and we know that she did. Her honors included Iowa Social Studies Teacher of the Year, the North Scott Distinguished Service Award (1968 -1993), and the Iowa Distinguished Teacher Award for the University of Iowa.

Phyllis' busy life continues today in Decorah, where she founded two Questors chapters dedicated to preserving and building awareness for local historic sites. She has mentored a woman who is learning English as a second language. She's active in a book club and is traveling around the world. In May, she explored Russian culture in Moscow, St. Petersburg and remote points between.

Daughter Pat Beck says her mother's energy, optimism and "can do" attitude have always been an inspiration to our family, and we would add, to the entire family of North Scott. Thank you for all you have done, Phyllis, and congratulations!

DRAMA, VOCAL & INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Our honorees are a husband and wife team – Brian and Sherri Marceau – who are being recognized in three categories: Drama, Vocal Music, and Instrumental Music.

Brian served two terms as Music Booster chair and two terms as co-chair, serving on numerous committees. He facilitated the moving of the music library cabinets from the band area to the choir area and was instrumental in revamping of the senior music scholarship process. Brian is a piano technician who donated labor and parts to refurbishing the auditorium grand piano. He is known for thinking outside the box, and invited a North Scott alum from New York City, Nate Meyer, who is working in New York City, to speak to seniors about his career in musical theater.

Sherri is the principal at Alan Shepard Elementary School. She served on the Music Booster grant writing committee and received two grants from Hubbell Waterman and Community Foundation of the Great River Bend for acoustical shells that cost \$13,000, and a third

one from Moonlight Chase Committee for a performer conductors' podium. Sherri also continues to assist with uniform alterations of many dresses and robes.

Sherri has designed, built and altered countless costumes for the theater department. Her latest creations included a hamburger and hotdog hats which were featured in the recent musical Footloose. Brian and Sherri ran concession stands in the theater and also sold flowers during productions. Brian worked countless hours posting signs outdoors and throughout the community. The Marceaus worked very hard on marketing and advertising at all the elementaries, and writing public service announcements for upcoming shows.
