Assumption, Bettendorf, Muscatine win first in sportsmanship for winter sports

Assumption, Bettendorf and Muscatine are the winners of first-place awards for best sportsmanship in winter sports in the Mississippi Athletic Conference, as judged by game officials.

The awards, sponsored by area Rotary clubs, will be presented Wednesday, April 13 at 7 p.m. at Davenport West High School.

Assumption was the first-place winner for boys' basketball and **Bettendorf** won first for girls' basketball.

Muscatine was judged to have the best sportsmanship for wrestling.

Bettendorf's average rating for girls' basketball was a perfect 1.00, and **Assumption's** average rating in boys' basketball was 1.14. **Muscatine's** average rating for wrestling was 1.05. Clinton was a close second in girls' basketball with an average rating of 1.03. Bettendorf and Muscatine were second and third, respectively, in boys' basketball with average ratings of 1.19 and 1.20, and Clinton and Davenport Central were second and third in wrestling with ratings of 1.06 and 1.08.

The average ratings for all teams were 1.42 for boys' basketball, 1.22 for girls' basketball and 1.09 for wrestling.

LAST WEEK – April 8, 2016 – Tom Leiting: CEO River Valley Cooperative

Seventy two attended on Friday, what Tom Leiting referred to as a “rough crowd”. The River Valley Cooperative has a payroll of 19 million dollars per year and encompasses numerous communities in Eastern Iowa and Western Illinois. Every community has very active employee teams. The Coop has 14 grain elevators that can store 52 million bushels. Sales per year include feed rations and consultation services for swine, turkey and cattle. They provide energy to about 4000 homes, in the form of home heating fuel and also agronomy services to RVC members. This spring RVC will serve about a million acres with various chemicals. The largest shipping point is ADM in Clinton. The storage in Eldridge and DeWitt makes these deliveries convenient.

Guests on Friday were Davenport Rotarians Carl Zurborg and Ralph Heninger. Also present were prospective members Scott Earl from the Y and Dr. Don Sierk. Other guests were Rev. Ron Barnett, Don, Mary Jo and Megan Olsen. Patrick Olsen was presented with the Paul Hellwege Guardian of Integrity award from the District Conference the week before. Paul Seelau presented the club with 2 awards. They were the Governor's citation and for achieving a 100 percent giving club in the Rotary Foundation. Bill Tubbs received two prestigious awards at the conference. They will be highlighted at the April 22 club meeting.

John Maxwell was the sergeant and collected \$73 in fines. That included the birth announcements of Mike Thavenet's new granddaughter and Fred Mulch's new great grandson. As usual, various members were fined for NOT sitting at the birthday table (Jan Trimble and Steve Fahrenkrog) when it was their birth month.
