St. Ambrose University officials have announced the public launch of a fundraising campaign that will fund the largest single capital project in the institution's 134-year history. The "Building Our Future Campaign" will help address the University's need for additional wellness, recreation, academic and athletics-related facilities through its priority capital project, the construction of a new Wellness and Recreation Center.

The new Wellness and Recreation Center will have 80,000-square-feet of space. It will be located adjacent to, and just west of, the current Physical Education Center on the north side of the St. Ambrose campus near its Lombard Street border.

Work is scheduled to be completed in time for use by the class entering in fall 2017. The new facilities will pro-

vide exercise and activity space for the general student population, lab space for some of the University's health and wellness-related academic programs including Kinesiology, and much-needed practice space for student-athletes who participate in the University's 23 varsity sports.

P.J. Foley graduated from Alleman High School in Rock Island. In 2001, he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in History and Education and in 2005 received a Masters of Organizational Leadership, both from St. Ambrose University. P.J. has worked at St. Ambrose University since 2002 and most recently as the Director of Government & Community Relations.

Foundation Minute for Week of June 6

As of May 27, 2016, only sixteen cases of polio have been reported in the world – five in Afghanistan and eleven in Pakistan. The eradication of polio is clearly in site. So why contribute to PolioPlus any further...

According to David Green, Rotary Foundation's Coordinator for PolioPlus:

“Our funds are not only working to interrupt the transmission of the wild poliovirus in the two remaining endemic countries (Pakistan and Afghanistan), but also to keep the rest of the world polio-free. For example, there are up to 60 countries still conducting large-scale immunization campaigns this year, many at risk of the virus returning due to conflict, weak health systems and other emergencies. As we get closer to the end, we also need to increase surveillance, to ensure the virus is truly gone from other parts of the world. Given that only one in 200 cases of polio result in paralysis, we rely on the program's extensive surveillance/laboratory network to tell us where polio does (and does not) exist.

Furthermore, until polio is eradicated, the risk of resurgence remains. Failure to eradicate polio could result in global resurgence of the disease, with 200,000 new cases every single year, within ten years, all over the world.”

LAST MEETING-- June 3, 2016 – Merle Anderson; Global Grant Project for Uganda

Merle Anderson, with the help of others, worked almost three years to make the Global Grant co-sponsored by the Rotary Club of North Scott and the Rotary Club of Masaka, Uganda finally become a reality. As Merle said on Friday, he encountered MANY road blocks in the lengthy ordeal. Merle and Glen Keppy obtained support from six other local Rotary clubs, besides North Scott. Personal contributors were Merle, Glen and Bill Tubbs. PDG Gary Welch from Ankeny helped obtain funds from the Hy-Vee Corporation totaling \$23,117 from the sales of the bottled water that they promote in all their stores. After the funds are matched by the Rotary Foundation, the grant will exceed \$80,000.

Some of the things the money will do are rent more land for the people, so they may double and triple the food crops and will be able to sell the excess. Seeds, pesticides and plant food will be furnished to them. Baby chicks, meat goats and milk goats, along with feed, waterers and pens will be provided. A learning center will be built, to teach the proper techniques to the farmers, along with an eco-sun toilet. Water will be piped to Bubanga for 4000 residents from a nearby reservoir.

Sixty six attended on Friday. Visiting Rotarians were: Gary and Colleen Welch, Ankeny, Duncan Cameron, Naples, FL, Brock Earnhardt and Ken Beck, Davenport Rotary. Also Scott Earl, Tyler Bindrum and Mark Ridolfi, guest of Bill Tubbs. Patrick passed the red buckets to obtain funds to package meals at another all area Rotary meeting this fall. Cody announced the auction sponsorships that have already been promised.

Dr. Anita informed the club that honorary member Walter Bredbeck's health is failing and is in ICU in Des Moines. Paul Kalainoff asked for prayers for his wife Susan, as she faces treatment for reoccurring breast cancer. Pat DeLuca was the sergeant of arms and collected \$66 in fines.
