Like many young girls, her first paid work was babysitting. She also delivered newspapers during the summer.

Her first real job at age 16 was at a fast food restaurant. Over the years, she has held many different jobs from waitressing to fork-truck driver, administrative assistant to supervisor, all while raising a family and chipping away at completion of a college degree. These life experiences help her not only understand how to recognize and overcome barriers to personal and professional success but inspire others to do the same. She believes her work experiences were an essential part of this transformation.

A visionary, change agent and a social entrepreneur often leads her to be an advocate in-

terested in providing a voice for those less fortunate, protecting children, animals and the environment, while also focusing on the big picture ideals of fostering social capital and improving civic engagement. Regina has extensive work experience in Education, Health & Human Services, PR/Marketing, and Program Development. She holds a master's degree in education with an emphasis on educating for a culturally-diverse and pluralistic society. She has served in a variety of volunteer roles in her church and the community, especially around the subject of parental involvement in schools. These connections, in addition to her broad work history, have helped her network effectively and draw strong support for the successful launch of Dress for Success and its mission to assist unemployed women on the path to self-sufficiency.

Regina lives in Davenport with her husband, Kurt Fishwild, her cocker spaniel, two tabby cats and a tank of fish. Regina has two adult sons, one of which is a graduate of the University of Iowa, married and living/working in Los Angeles and the other is living with a chronic mental illness and subsists on Social Security Disability. Her daughter is also a grad of the University of Iowa, and after finishing a 5 month stint in Hawaii working on an organic farm, now lives in Los Angeles with her brother and plans to join the Peace Corps and head off to Nepal in April 2016. Regina enjoys reading, home improvement projects, walking/biking/hiking, and especially enjoys making public presentations such as this whenever she can to help spread the word about the great mission of Dress for Success Quad Cities.

District Governor Loring and Phyllis Miller visited North Scott Rotary Last week. One of their visits was to the 180 zone rehabilitation home at 910 Marquette, where they visited with Mathew Powell and saw the fire pit designed by Dennis Peterson and constructed by NS Rotarians and residents of the home. Also we landscaped the property and placed a Rotary marker rock to tell others what we have done.

NORTH SCOTT ROTARY IS A GIFT TO THE WORLD!

It was a delightful afternoon with the Millers after their visit to our club on Friday. They were interested in our projects that have been "branded" for Rotary.

Things couldn't have gone better at the 180 Zone on Marquette Street. We pulled into the driveway and met Mathew Powell, who is a graduate of the 180 Zone and now is employed there. He is a college engineering graduate who hit rock bottom in his life because of alcohol and was in and out of prison. He has turned his life around and been alcohol-free for 1-1/2 years, "thank you Jesus," he said. He said the 180 Zone made all the difference, and thanked Rotary from the bottom of his heart for the fire pit and landscaping that we provided last spring, with assistance from a Rotary Foundation Community Grant. (He gave me his phone number and said he would gladly come to a Rotary meeting to share his story.) The fire pit is used regularly and just last night, he said, the residents made a fire and sang songs. Loring and Phyllis were deeply touched by Matthew's testimony, as was I. Sometimes we wonder if the time and energy and money we put into projects make a difference or if we're just going through the motions, but an experience like this validates everything we do. This was an impactful visit and I was glad to have been a part of it with our district governor and his lovely wife. Thank you to past president Scott Case for putting us in touch with the 180 Zone, to past president Steve Fahrenkrog for having the vision to make it our district project, and Tom Wilkerson who designed the fire pit and the Rotarians who supported it in any way. Together, we are changing lives. We are a "Gift to the World."

Next we stopped at Family Resources, where North Scott Rotary's Centennial project in 2004-05 proudly stands. We renovated a kitchen in an area where troubled juveniles are sent to put their lives back together, and we landscaped the flagpole area. I took Loring and Phyllis' picture with the North Scott Rotary dedication stone at the flagpole site.

Then it was on to the Handicapped Development Center on Brady Street where Tiffany Sprague showed us the room that North Scott Rotary sponsored during Scott Kurtz's president's year and we took a picture there, too. The room has been converted into a library and we discussed the kinds of books that are in that library -- and others that would benefit the persons served by the HDC. (A future project?)

Our last stops were at Eldridge where we took a picture at one of the Rotary park benches that were supported with a Rotary Foundation Community Grant during Gary Lynch's president's year, and lastly, the Eldridge "Rotary" town clock that was a gift from the Bill and Linda Tubbs family. It was an afternoon well spent and Loring and Phyllis departed for the 3-hour, 40-minute trip home to Leon, in Decatur County, Iowa, near the Missouri border. Thanks to all our members, past and present, who have made North Scott Rotary a "Gift to the World." -- Bill Tubbs
