Hero Street U.S.A. was honored in 2010 as the best history book of the year by the International Latino Literacy Council. The book has since been translated into Spanish. The book documents the compelling story of the Mexican immigrants who settled on Second Street in Silvis, Ill., early in the early 1900s and fought courageously for the United States in World War II and the Korean War, suffering more casualties for troops from any one location than anywhere in the U.S. It is one of the great stories of our Quad Cities region.

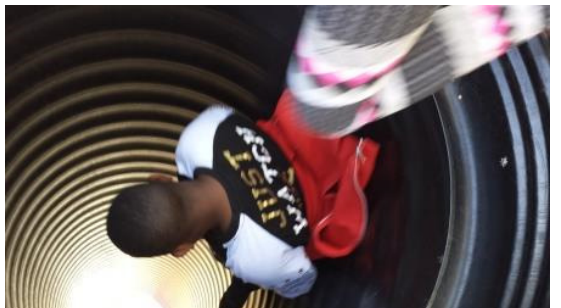
Marc Wilson, author of Hero Street U.S.A., is a journalist who has worked as a reporter for three daily newspapers and five bureaus of The Associated Press. He was co-owner and editor and publisher of the weekly *Bigfork Eagle* in Montana for 14 years.

While in Montana, he started TownNews.com, which today is based in Moline, Ill., and provides Internet and digital services for more than 1,600 newspapers, TV and radio stations. Among TownNews.com's local customers are *The North Scott Press*, the *Moline Dispatch* and the *Quad-City Times*.
