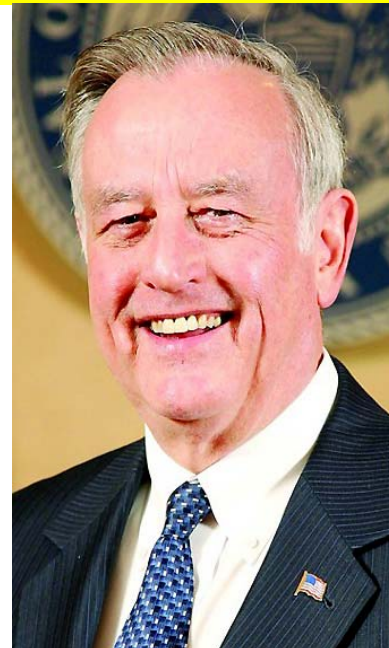

Prior to being elected to the Iowa General Assembly. Bill was asked to teach an American Government class for a semester at St. Ambrose.

He has served this community as a State Representative, State Senator Chairman of the Scott County Board of Supervisors and was first elected Mayor of Davenport in November, 2007 and is serving his 4th term.

LAST MEETING – October 23, 2015 – Marc Wilson; Author and Businessman

Marc Wilson is a journalist and author of Hero Street U.S.A. His book tells the story of Mexican immigrants who settled in Silvis, IL and fought for the United States in World War II and the Korean War. These troops had more casualties than any other group. Many are buried at the Rock Island Arsenal cemetery. The local VFW blackballed these people, so they started their own VFW in East Moline, IL. It is still very active today. Marc sold 2 of his books after the meeting and gave the \$40 to the club for our educational fund.

Seventy one attended on Friday, including Iowa Quad City Rotarian, Dave Borcharding. Other guests were: Dr. Lana Groom, guest of Fred Mulch, and Jan Touney, Derek Sawvell, and Gary Sosniecki, all guests of Bill Tubbs. Eight student guests were present and two chaperones.
