MARLITA GREVE: CHIEF JUDGE OF THE 7TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

Marlita A. Greve graduated from the University of Iowa College of Law in 1992 with high distinction. Prior to attending law school, Judge Greve worked in the banking industry in Clinton for approximately 12 years. After graduation from law school, she was in private practice for 14 years specializing in employment discrimination and general civil litigation.

In 2006, Judge Greve was appointed as a District Court Judge in the 7th Judicial District of Iowa. In April of 2013, she was appointed as Chief Judge of the 7th Judicial District.

Judge Greve serves on the statewide Advisory Committee Concerning Certain Civil Justice Reform Task Force Recommendations; the statewide committee charged with improving guardianships and conservatorships in Iowa; a statewide committee to hire a new State Court Administrator; the statewide committee on Jury Reform, the Supreme Court Advisory Committee on the Rules of Civil Procedure; and chaired the Judicial Workload Study Committee, which looked at the need of judicial officers in Iowa.

She also served on the statewide committee that formulated the Expedited Civil Action rule and discovery amendments to the Iowa Rules of Civil Procedure. Locally, Judge Greve has served on a variety of local committees designed to enhance and improve the service of justice to the citizens of Iowa, especially in the 7th Judicial District, which includes Cedar, Clinton, Jackson, Muscatine and
