THIS FRIDAY AT THE STEEPLEGATE

For 783 million people, drinking water looks like this.



For these 783 million people, there are no taps, no supermarkets stocked to the brim with beverage choices. In the majority of these cases, the only water source is a natural one. This includes streams, rivers, ponds, and lakes.

Drinking isn't the only thing the water is used for either. Both the local wildlife and human population use this water for washing and as a bathroom too. As many are stagnant, these water sources become breeding grounds for water borne diseases such as typhoid and cholera.

Due to diseases like this, **3.4 million people die annually from a lack of pure water.** To put it in perspective, those 3.4 million people could fill Wrigley Field in Chicago to capacity more than 86 times over.

Clean water, or the lack there of, is a worldwide epidemic. However there is an affordable, effective solution that will save lives.

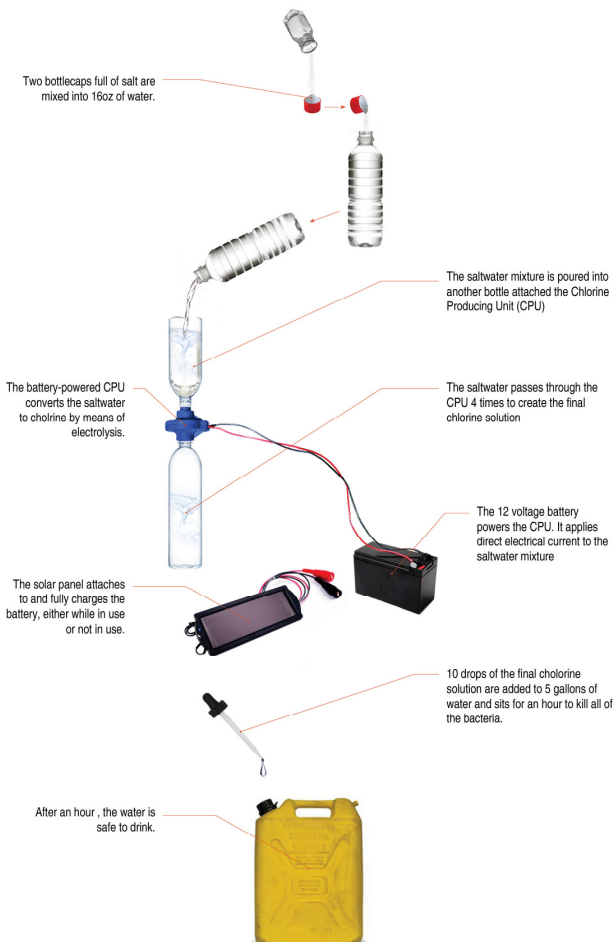

LAST WEEK – February 17, 2017 – Doug Cropper: President and CEO: Genesis Health Systems

Sixty two members and guests attended on Friday, including visiting Rotarian Steve Goebel from the East Moline/Silvis Rotary club and Kristen Ockerman, guest of Ken Ockerman. Jan Trimble gave an update on her son's recent hospitalization and surgery. We welcomed back Kelly Meyer, after being absent several weeks, dealing with her family tragedy. She thanked everyone for their messages, prayers and concerns.

John Maxwell was the sergeant and collected \$14 in fines. President Jeff Helms mentioned that the community needs committee met earlier that morning and the first round of grants to be given out, will be voted on, at the March 3 board meeting. Charlie Jones announced that the playground funding drive has reached \$90,700.

Doug Cropper gave an overview of Genesis Hospitals and the U.S. Healthcare, need for reform and affordable care act. He has 37 years of healthcare experience. He currently oversees six hospitals, over 100 sites of service and a workforce of 5000 plus. Doug said that entitlements are a huge problem. People with no insurance show up at the emergency rooms for treatment and by law, they have to be treated. In most cases, the hospital has to absorb the price of the service rendered. Hawaii has the lowest cost of health care and the highest medical spending occurs in Texas and Louisiana. Doug keeps up-to-date on the bills going on in Washington, D.C. concerning healthcare. He wonders what Trump will do.....
