## THIS FRIDAY AT THE STEEPLGATE



Stacie Kintigh is a 25 year education veteran who is currently in her first year as Project SEARCH Instructor for the UnityPoint Health - Trinity Project SEARCH training program in Bettendorf. A graduate of Northern Illinois University with a B.S. in Special Education, Stacie began her special education career in 1991 at Tiskilwa Schools in Tiskilwa, Illinois. Over the years, she has taught at Riverdale High School in Port Byron, Illinois, Geneseo Jr. and Sr. High Schools in Geneseo, Illinois, Belle Plaine High School in Belle Plaine, Iowa, and has been with North Scott High School in Eldridge for the past sixteen years. Stacie is also the director of Lancer Productions at North Scott High School. Stacie has been a champion of transition for youth with disabilities

throughout her career. Three years ago, Stacie and two NSHS Special Education colleagues were working to develop a fifth year transition program which could provide a work-based transition opportunity for students with disabilities. In the fall of 2014, friends from the Mississippi Bend AEA attended a transition conference in Iowa City and learned of Project SEARCH; they shared the information with Stacie and together created a plan to bring Project SEARCH to North Scott High School. In the fall of 2015, with the assistance of Jane Rock, Michelle Wehr, and Frank Wood, two local riverboat grants were secured and Project SEARCH became a reality for North Scott, Bettendorf, and Pleasant Valley special needs students. The current Project SEARCH class began their journey to independence on August 23rd 2016. They have completed two internship rotations and have recently begun their third; they will graduate from Project SEARCH on May 26th 2017.
