Born and raised in Rock Island Illinois, graduated from Augustana College in Rock Island in 1973. Began my teaching career at North Scott Jr-Sr. High School in the fall of 1973. I taught Physical Education, coached a variety of sports and was the youngest Athletic Director in the State of Iowa at the age of 22. During this time, I saw North Scott Community School district grow and was a part of three different athletic conferences during my 7 years as Athletic Director. (Illowa, Big Bend and the Mississippi Eight Athletic Conference - now known as the MAC. I taught for 14 years at North Scott before leaving and beginning my Administrative career at Rock Island High School as a Dean of Students. I spent two years as a dean before moving on to the High School Principals position at Riverdale High School in Port Byron Illinois. I spent 4 years as their principal before being asked to come back to Rock Island as their Assistant Principal. I would remain at Rocky for 6 years ending my last year as the interim principal in the 98-99 school year. I returned to North Scott in the fall of 1999 as their Associate Principal at the

High school moving from the AP position to the Activities Director's position and then back to the AP position during this 18 year stint. I am now the interim principal at Neil Armstrong Elementary in Park View filling in for the remainder of this school year, when I will return to the high school for the 17-18 school year as their AP once again.

New students have access to the space and they are using it appropriately with great success.
