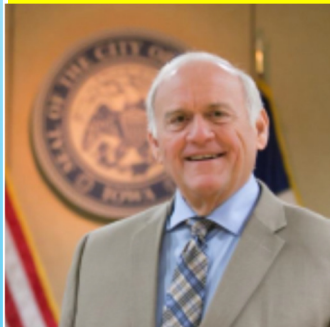
NEW MEMBER: NIKKI DILLON

Frank J. Klipsch Mayor-City of Davenport, Iowa

Frank J. Klipsch was elected in November of 2015 to the position of Mayor of Davenport, and began serving in January of 2016. He currently runs an independent consultation and professional services firm, and also serves as an adjunct leadership studies professor at Saint Ambrose University.

Before being elected as Mayor, Klipsch worked for the Scott County Family YMCA; first as CEO from 1987 until 2012, and then as President of the YMCA Youth and Family Foundation in 2013 and 2014.

He has helped lead several organizations as a board member during that time, some of which include Quad City Scholars, CASI, Palmer College of Chiropractic, the Davenport Rotary, German American Heritage Center, and the Quad City Cultural Trust.

Prior to moving to Davenport, Klipsch served in various roles within the YMCA; as Executive Director of the Roswell YMCA in Roswell, New Mexico (1984-1987), Associate Executive & Program Director of the Naperville YMCA in Naperville, Illinois (1978-1984), and Director of Health and Physical Education of the Tucson YMCA in Tucson, Arizona (1972-1978). He earned a Masters of Education, with an emphasis in Sports Psychology, from the University of Arizona, and a Bachelor of Science in Health and Physical Education from Missouri State University. He also received an honorary doctorate in Public Service from Saint Ambrose University in 2015. Klipsch was born in St. Louis, Missouri and is the oldest of seven siblings. He married his wife, Terre, in 1970, and together they have four children; Frank, Jake, Zach, and Kaitlyn, as well as ten grandchildren; Cassius, Julius, Oliver, Elihu, Sintaeyu, Trysten, Tariku, Dailah, Tomas, and Binyum.

Many able hands and bodies will be needed to unload the two semi-trailers in June and build the structure in the fall. Exciting times are ahead!
