### ROTARY REACHING OUT FOR FRIENDSHIP AND POLIO ERADICATION IN PAKISTAN

This Friday we welcome Jim Nelson to North Scott Rotary to tell us about Rotary's Friendship Exchange program and a recent trip that he and other Rotarians from District 6420 in northern Illinois took to Pakistan on behalf of Rotary.

Jim is one of only a few Rotarians who have traveled to Pakistan, so Friday is a rare and unique opportunity to learn about a country that is vital in the global quest to eradicate polio, since Pakistan is one of only two remaining countries where the wild polio virus is still alive. Rotary's global quest to eradicate the crippling disease began in 1987.

Jim is a member of the Rotary Club of Rockford, Ill., and was District Governor of District 6420 in 2015-16. A retired newspaper publisher, he was active in Rotary in Dixon, Ill., and Newton, Iowa, before moving to Rockford. For many years, he was active in Rotary Youth Exchange in District 6000.

Jim and his wife, Linda, have been married more than 46 years. They are parents of two daughters, and have five grandchildren and one great grandson. Their youngest daughter was a Youth Exchange student to Sweden many years ago. Jim is a Vietnam veteran who served with the USN Seabees in Vietnam's I-corps in 1969 and 1970. -- Bill Tubbs

The John Deere Classic will take place on August 11-14, 2016. The Pro-Am takes place on Wednesday, August 10.

In cooperation with the Iowa Quad-Cities Rotary Club, we will be marshaling #16 again this year. We need you to consider being a marshal for one or two days. It is fun and you get to see professional golfers up close. You do not need to be a golfer to marshal.

Sign-up at Rotary on one of the sheets on your table. John Gere will confirm the date(s) of your preference. You can then register at the John Deere Classic web site. Indicate that you are with the Iowa Quad-Cities / North Scott Rotary Clubs and marshal on #16.

You are required to purchase a JDC shirt for \$25. If you want to wear a cap, it must be a JDC cap. They cost \$10. A visor is \$10 or you can buy a floppy hat or a straw hat for \$15. Those items will be available to pick up at the John Deere World Headquarters on Tuesday, July 26 from 4-8 PM, Wednesday, July 27 from 4-8 PM or Thursday, July 28 from 10 AM - 2 PM.

You must wear khaki or stone slacks or shorts. Shifts normally start about 8:15 AM and runs until about 5:00 PM. A light lunch and water are provided. Bring along a lawn chair.

### LAST WEEK

LAST WEEK – July 8 – Dr. Louis Katz, Chief Medical Officer of America's Blood Centers

Dr. Katz spoke to us about the dangers and details of the Zika virus. The disease was identified in the forest of Uganda, Africa. A research area is located within this forest. The mosquito bears a flavivirus. Only the female mosquitos bite and are most aggressive in the daytime hours. They need blood meal to survive. Zika has been around since 2007, but became more well-known lately.

The ideal condition for the mosquitos is in Puerto Rica, the gulf coasts of Florida and Texas. High humidity and the length of daylight hours attract them. The West Nile virus is a far greater risk than the Zika virus. The only treatment for the virus is a complete plasma exchange.

Assistant District Governor, Brock Earnhardt was present and presented President Jeff Helms with the new theme flag for this year. Glen Keppy asked for sign-ups for the Corn Boil and Deb Peterson asked for volunteers to work at the Fair. New committee assignments will be available soon.

Friday was the first 50/50 member drawing for the auction. Greg Schaapveld was the lucky winner of \$95. Dr. Brad Burt was the (last minute) volunteer sergeant and collected \$34 in fines.
