We are happy to have the opportunity for North Scott Rotarians to hear about Life Care Planning and the impact it has on families who are caregiving for someone with a disability. In times of emotional stress, the financial implications of a disability are often “shelved” for when the parent/caregiver has more time. This is understandable and even sometimes necessary, to meet all the requirements of raising a child with a disability or other special need or attending to a family member after a catastrophic injury. Caring for a person with a disability or other special need and making sure all of his or her needs are met is the caregiver’s first priority.

The special needs community is growing at a phenomenal rate. People with disabilities constitute the nation’s largest minority group not based on nationality but on circumstance². With higher survival rates, great life expectancies, and more extensive therapies – the likelihood that many of us will have to provide for others and the costs associated with that responsibility have increased considerably. For people with physical, mental or emotional disabilities, health issues are only the beginning. Life’s challenges extend into many other areas as well including earning and supplementing an income, creating a safe and accessible living environment, fulfilling special equipment needs, obtaining the extra help needed to get an education, and increasing personal independence. Hence the need for a program that provides access to information and specialists that will help caregivers make those all-important life care planning decisions.

Don Olsen, CLU, ChFC, CASL, CFS, Chartered Special Needs Consultant (ChSNC), and Special Care Planner founded Olsen Financial in 1978. Pat Olsen, Special Care Planner, joined his dad in 2008 and Olsen Financial was restructured into a family partnership. Together they assist individuals and families, who are caregiving for an individual with special needs, navigate through the intricate process of careful life care planning.

Rotary ramps up response to this killer disease

The World Health Organization has confirmed two cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) in Nigeria, the first cases in the country since July 2014. After passing a year without a case of the wild poliovirus, Nigeria was removed from the list of polio-endemic countries in September 2015. These cases – from two local government areas of Borno state – occurred in July 2016.

The Government of Nigeria – in partnership with the Global Polio Eradication Initiative – will take immediate steps to respond quickly to the outbreak to prevent further spread of the disease. This response will include emergency vaccination campaigns to boost immunity in impacted and at-risk areas, and reinforced surveillance activities to ensure we detect all strains of polio. Because polio knows no borders, steps will also be taken to protect surrounding countries, to ensure all children are vaccinated and to reduce the risk of the spread of the disease.

This news is disappointing for all Rotary members - and particularly those in Nigeria - who worked so hard to help the country stop polio. However, Rotary remains steadfast and fully committed to fighting polio anywhere children remain at risk, including Nigeria and Africa.

Rotary members remain resilient in the face of challenges. Today, we roll up our sleeves and redouble our effort to rid the world of this devastating disease. Rotary members in Nigeria are already hard at work to support the outbreak response, and our network will also be tapped to quickly protect children in surrounding countries.

The World Health Organization is confident Nigeria can end polio. The program has overcome outbreaks before, and we have the tools to do so again in Nigeria. Rotary will not stop its efforts to ensure that every child is born into a polio-free world where they are safe from this paralyzing disease.
