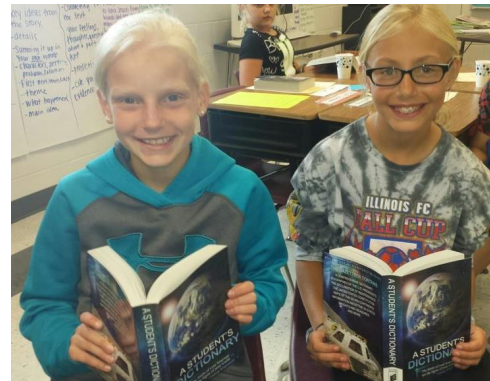


Rotary Dictionary handouts At Alan Shepard School

Henry Latham was appointed by Governor Branstad to a two year term as a Drug Court Judge. He currently has 20 in his drug program. The majority of the adults he works with are male. He uses the One Eighty Zone and Salvation Army to help rehabilitate the men. Women can be sent to Norma's Place, all depending on availability. Henry says that drug addiction is a community problem, and that marijuana is a gateway drug. He has open drug court on Fridays. He keeps very close track of his graduates and is extremely proud of the ones who kick the habit and stay out of jail.

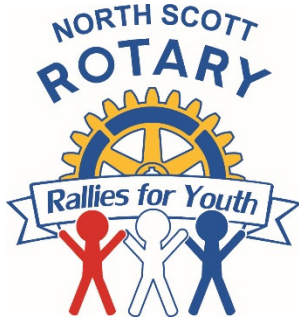
