Important Information The Board of Directors

Has considered all of the factors presented below, and has voted to increase dues by \$5 per quarter starting July 1st, 2018. It has been 3 years since a dues increase. Some of the reasons for this increase are an increase of meal costs of 25cents per meal, and an increase in District and International Rotary dues. This will then have our dues being \$175.00 per quarter, and Paul Harris Society support of \$25 to the International Foundation Support. This makes a total per quarter per member of \$200. If you attend all meetings, your dues barely cover meal costs, and then there are district and international dues per member. These costs are offset by member meals not used per week, plus Fines, 50/50, and Other Miscellaneous Income from members.

LAST WEEK – February 2, 2018 – Chaplain John Yarian

In the five Genesis Hospitals in the Quad Cities, around 450 people die each year. Medicare mandates that Greif Support is offered for the family or contact list for each patient. Many people think that to be sad, is bad. John Yarian, the grief support coordinator for Genesis Health System, says NO, being sad is not bad! Greif counseling is offered for 13 months. Sometimes the one year anniversary of a death is the hardest time to handle.

There are five stages of grief. First is denial, then anger, bargaining, depression and acceptance. The worst two are anger and depression. Genesis offers education courses, support groups and online resources, such as blogs, newsletters and testimonials. They also have a bi-monthly newsletter, age appropriate reading material and grief counseling for families, couples, children and teens.

The meeting was attended by 51 members and guests. Guests were Stanley Speed and John Hutchcroft, both introduced by Patrick Olsen. A personal birthday table was set for Jeff Ashcraft and Ryan Davis, the only two February birthdays in Rotary. (Thanks, Josie). Marcia Brandt told how much she enjoyed reading at Donahue on Tuesday and Scott Case gave \$25 to the education fund in honor of the Lady Lancer basketball team. John Maxwell said that his Jersey herd of dairy cows won #1 in Protein and #2 in Milk production in the nation. Chris Cournoyer told of her involvement with the Quad City STEM program.

Leroy Paustian won this month's 50/50 drawing and took home \$92. John was the sergeant and raised \$26 in fines.
