A little about Central Singers, Incorporated:

- It is the oldest, and most successful show choir in the Quad Cities. We are currently wrapping up our 38th year of competition.
- CSI is currently ranked as the 40th best show choir in the nation
- This year's group has placed 3rd Runner Up, 2nd Runner-Up, and two 1st Runners-Up and are going for their first Grand Championship of the year on March 10th in Janesville, Wisconsin

This year's group has won the following caption awards: Best Costumes, Best Male Performer, Best Male Soloist, twice for Best Band, and Peyton Reese (Scott's granddaughter) has won the caption award for Best Female Soloist within a show.

- The doors are the lobby doors on the far south of the building. They are doors 9SW and 8SE (obviously located on the Southwest and Southeast areas, respectively)
- I would **recommend carpooling** if at all possible as school is in session and spaces will be at a premium. Please leave plenty of time to park and enter the building.

I would also recommend parking in the lower south lot. Basically, just beyond the pool is a drive way that leads to small parking lots by doors 9SW and 8SE....those spots fill up quickly. The NEXT DRIVEWAY is a parking lot that connects Harrison to Main. When you park there you can walk up a small series of steps and enter into the auditorium. The auditorium is directly south of the pool and is the building with all of the windows facing the river.

Fifty five attended on Friday, including guests Bob Doerfer, guest of Alex Dirck, Tony Knobbe, guest of Ken Tank and Linda Greelee, chair of Scott County Republican party, guest of John Maxwell. Also student and veteran Brandon Olsen, from WIU, who accompanied the speaker.

March birthdays were celebrated. Jeff Ashcraft sold 50/50 tickets this week. The lucky winner of the drawing was Jon Cole, winning \$87. Dr. Brad Burt was the sergeant and collected \$38 in fines. John Maxwell gave \$20 to the education fund for his candidacy for county supervisor. Chris Cournoyer is also gathering signatures for a District 49 Senate seat.

Paul Plagenz said that it is a challenging time for WIU. Enrollment is down 15 per cent in Macomb and 5 per cent in the Q.C. With the economic situation with Illinois, no one is excited to attend college in Illinois. They had hoped to expand the Civil Engineering program, but no capital projects are being started.

WIU lowered their tuition three years ago to attract more students. A full time student pays \$9000 per year to attend. 84 per cent of WIU graduates stay within 40 miles when they graduate. The Q.C. campus has a new library, which Paul invited all to visit.
