Courtney currently serves as Director of Community Integration for Transitions Mental Health Services and is contracted as the Scott County Mental Health Court Coordinator. Transitions MHS is a nonprofit mental health agency dedicated to improving the mental health of all Quad City citizens on both sides of the river and beyond. Above all, we respect the dignity and worth of every person we serve. We are dedicated to quality, continual growth and positive outcomes for our clientele, staff, customers, and community. Courtney has been a vital part of the Restorative Justice Task Force for over 3 years. This task force is responsible for starting the Scott County Mental Health Court Pilot Program. This program is designed to provide an alternative to jail for persons

with chronic mental health needs who commit crimes meeting established criteria. Mental Health Court, through intensive individualized services, will help these offenders with chronic mental health needs treat their illness, take their medication as prescribed, meet their basic needs, and avoid expensive incarceration or hospitalization. The goal of Mental Health Court is to impose a sentence that provides the maximum opportunity for the rehabilitation of the defendant, the protection of the community from further offenses by the defendant and consideration of the victim's rights and safety. In addition to her role with the SC MHC Program, she has been a team member with the Rock Island Co. Mental Health Court since its start in 2007. Courtney has her Bachelors from Western Illinois University, is a certified Recreational Therapist, and has over 13 years of experience in the mental health field.
