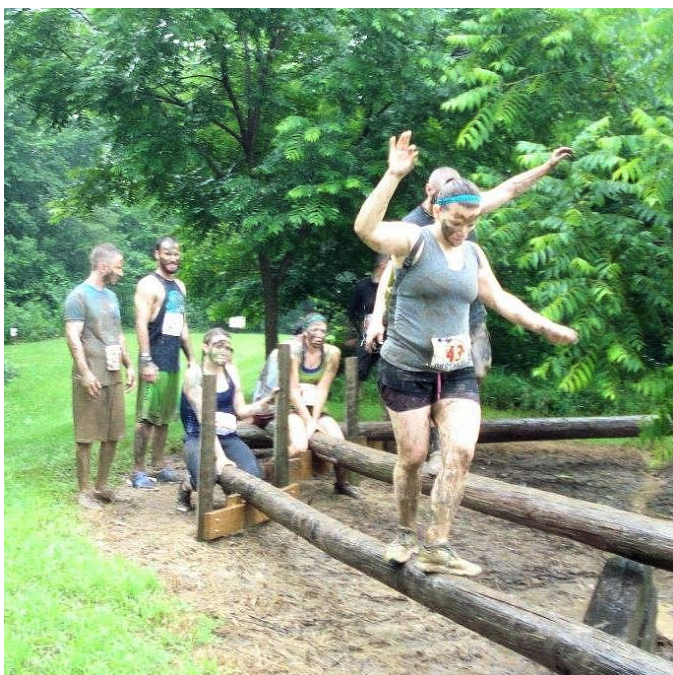

This week's speaker was Paul Boffeli, the president and co-founder of Build to Suit, Inc. His current project is the construction of the TBK Bank Sports Complex, formerly known as Bett Plex. It is a multi-million dollar project which just happened to open on May 4 to the public, as he was speaking at Rotary. It is a family entertainment center covering 77 acres on Middle Road and Interstate 80 in Bettendorf. The complex has something for everyone. Soccer, football, basketball, lacrosse, volleyball, sand volleyball, batting cages, golf driving range, physical therapy facility, food courts and even a couple bars. There are also 32 bowling lanes, laser tag, video game arcade and space suitable for banquets and meetings. Some courts are outside, some indoor. Also there will be 1600 parking spaces.
