Dr. Fred Mulch announced that he is now the proud owner of a Veterinary practice in Illinois. Jeff Ashcraft thanked John Maxwell and Kelly Meyer for stepping up to complete the Santa Visit package sold at the auction. Rich Horst announced that he has officially retired from Eastern Iowa Community College as of December 31, 2017.

Dick Cole introduced Karen Relf, Program Director at the Abbey Addiction Treatment Center. The Abbey has been many things since it was built in 1914. It was built as a home for the Carmelite Nuns. It is an amazing facility. After the nuns, it was home to a group of Monks. They used to decorate the building for Christmas and it was open to the public at that time. For a period of time, it was a wedding venue. You could get married there, have a reception and rent the rooms for guests who desired to spend the night.

In 2008, the Abbey received its first client, as an addiction treatment center. It was a gentleman who desired to get sober. Most treatment programs are 28 days long. An assessment on people is done, before they are accepted into the facility. Most insurance companies will cover this treatment. Addiction is usually a family disease. Areas treated are addictions, mental health, depression, anxiety, trauma, bi-polar, grief, loss and anger. They also offer therapy in the areas of music, yoga, art and meditation. After care programs are also available, for clients who need them.
